THE OPENING TIP

DURR NAMED TO WOODEN MIDSEASON TOP 25

Asia Durr has been named to the Wooden Midseason Top 25 as announced last week. She is averaging 21.4 points per game, which ranks second in the ACC and 12th in the country. She is connecting on 2.5 3-point field goals per game, which ranks fourth in the ACC. She is 67-80 (.838) from the free throw line, which ranks 11th in ACC. She is shooting 78-136 (.574) from 2-point range and 40-124 (.323) from deep. She tied a career-high with 10 made free throws at Notre Dame (10-12). She opened the season 19-20 from the stripe. With 33 points at Western Kentucky, 24 at Chattanooga, 20 at Boise State, 20 vs. Hartford, 25 vs. Nebraska, 25 vs. UT Martin, 32 vs. UK, 31 at CMU, 29 at ND and 21 vs. GT, Durr has 11 career 30-point games and 47 career 20-point games. She has scored in double figures in all 16 games this season.

SAMIAM

Fuehring is averaging 10.7 points, which ranks second on the team, while shooting 63-114 (.553) from the floor, which ranks ninth in the ACC. She is also averaging a team-high 6.6 rebounds. She recorded her second double-double of the season and the sixth of her career with 13 points and 14 rebounds vs. Georgia Tech. She had 14 points and 10 rebounds vs. Nebraska. She had a team-high 18 points and nine rebounds, including the game-winning layup with 2.5 seconds to go vs. Arizona State, then had 19 points, which tied a career-high, and five rebounds vs. Hartford. She was also 8-8 from the line. She had 10 points and 0 rebounds vs. Miami, it marked first time since March 20, 2017 vs. Tennessee in NCAA Tournament that she didn't pull down a rebound. She has scored in double figures in eight of 16 games.

SCORING MARGIN

UofL ranks third in the ACC and 16th in the country with an +18.4 scoring margin. Eleven wins have been by 17 or more points, seven by 22-plus points.

PUTTING UP POINTS

UofL ranks 15th in the country and second in the ACC in scoring offense with 81.4 points per game. They have scored 100-plus three times, 90-plus five times, 80-plus eight times and 70-plus in 13 of 16 games. After reaching 70-plus in 13 of the first 14 games, they have failed to reach the mark in the last two.

ABOUT THE CAVALIERS

Virginia enters Thursday's game with a 7-10 overall record, 1-3 in ACC, in head coach Tina Thompson's first year at the helm. They are 1-3 in true road games, falling 63-51 at Kentucky, 91-66 at Michigan State and 71-65 at Clemson, and winning 73-67 at Old Dominion. The Cavaliers are second-to-last in the ACC with 58.8 points per game and their -5.5 scoring margin, 35.9 field goal percentage and 11.2 assists per game rank last. Junior Jocelyn Willoughby leads the team with 12.8 points and 7.8 rebounds per game. She is shooting 35-69 (.507) from 3-point range, which leads the ACC. Junior Dominique Toussaint averages 11.3 points per game and leads the team with 3.4 assists per game.

■ Series History - UofL is 7-2 all-time against UVA and 4-0 at the KFC Yum! Center. The Cardinals are 7-1 since joining the ACC and have won six straight. Last season, UofL won 77-41 at UVA and 51-39 at the KFC Yum! Center.

QUICK HITTERS

- In the last two seasons, the Cardinals are a combined 51-4.
- · Louisville has won 14 straight games at the KFC Yum! Center.
- · UofL has shot over 50 percent in eight games, but has missed the mark in the last five.

- Asia Durr has led the team in assists in three of the last five games, averaging 4.0 per game during that stretch, and ranks sixth in ACC with 1.9 assist-to-turnover ratio.
- With the 61-44 win over Georgia Tech, UofL avoided losing two straight games. They have not lost two straight since the 2016-17 season vs. NC State on 2/2/17 (L, 72-70) and at Notre Dame on 2/6/17 (L, 85-66).
- · After tying a career-high with 17 points vs. UNC, Jazmine Jones has just seven points combined in last three games.

PROVIDING AN ASSIST

Louisville is averaging 16.9 assists per game, which ranks fifth in the ACC and 32nd in the country. They have double-digit assists in 15 of 16 games. Against Georgia Tech, they assisted on 19 of 23 buckets, good for 83 percent. They have assists on 57 percent of their buckets this season.

LOW POINT TOTALS

After scoring 24 points in the first quarter vs. Georgia Tech, Louisville scored just 37 points the rest of the way (2nd-12, 3rd-8, 4th-17). The 61 points marked the second smallest point total this season. They had a season-low 58 vs. Arizona State (W, 58-56). The eight points in the third quarter tied their smallest point total in a quarter this season. They also had eight points in the third quarter vs. Arizona State.

TURN UP THE AC

Carter has scored in double figures in three of four ACC games and is averaging 14.0 points, while shooting 13-27 (.481) from downtown. In the win at Duke, she knocked down three 3-pointers in the first couple minutes to help the Cardinals jump out to an 11-2 lead. She finished the game with a career-high 23 points, while connecting on a career-high seven 3-pointers, going 7-10 from beyond the arc. She ranks third on team with 10.1 points per game and is shooting 34-74 (.459) from distance, which ranks third in the ACC and 16th in the country. She has started 12 of 16 games this season. She didn't start vs. WKU, which ended a stretch of 64 straight starts in games that she has played. Last season, she started all 38 games she played. Despite not starting, she scored 19 points in 19 minutes, shooting 6-10 from the floor and 4-7 from 3-point range. She missed the 2016-17 season with a groin injury. Last season, she shot 38.6 percent from 3-point range and connected on 49 3-pointers after entering the season with a career 16 made threes. She did not make a 3-pointer as a freshman.

BALANCED ATTACK

Three players are averaging double figures for the Cards, while seven players are averaging more than 7.4 points per game and 17.9 minutes per game. For the third time this season, at least five players scored in double figures for the Cards against UNC. They also had five in double figures vs. UK and six scored in double figures vs. Miami (Ohio). Overall, at least 11 players have played in 10 of 16 games, and at least nine have scored in seven games.

FORCING TURNOVERS

In the last 10 games, UofL has forced 203 turnovers or 20.3 per game. They forced 21 turnovers against Georgia Tech and 24 at Duke. They forced 27 against UTM and 29 vs. TSU, which is the most since they forced 31 vs. MTSU on 12/9/17. UofL had 49 points off turnovers against TSU. The most since Nov. 20, 2014 vs. Belmont when they had 48 points off turnovers.

DURR FROM DEFE

For the first time this season, Asia Durr didn't knock down a 3-pointer (0-7) in the win over UNC. She had connected on at least one 3-pointer in 17 straight games. It marks first time that Durr hasn't hit a 3-pointer since she went 0-4 vs. Boise State in the first round of the NCAA Tournament on 3/16/18. She owns the school-record of 59 straight games (3/5/15-1/25/18) with a 3-pointer. The previous record was 36 by Sara Nord (2/8/02-3/6/03).

DURR DROPS DIMES

Durr ranks sixth in the ACC with a 1.9 assist-to-TO ratio. She has led the team or tied for the team-lead in assists in three of five games. Overall, she has led the team in assists five times this year and 18 times in her career. She had a team-high six assists and one turnover vs. UNC. She dropped a career-high and team-high eight assists, five of which came in the fourth quarter, against Nebraska. Her previous career-high was seven assists vs. Syracuse on 2/4/18. She ranks second on the team and 12th in ACC with 3.6 assists. Last year she averaged 2.3 assists.

EVANS LOOKS LIKE ACC SIXTH PLAYERS OF THE YEAR

After starting the first two games, Evans has come off the bench in 13 of the last 14. She is fourth on the team with 9.8 points and is averaging a team-high 3.9 assists, which ranks ninth in ACC. She has 63 assists and 29 turnovers and ranks fourth in ACC with 2.2 assist-to-TO ratio. She has led the team in assists six times. In four ACC games, she is averaging 8.5 points, while shooting 6-14 from deep. She had 16 points and four assists at Duke. She had a careerigh 21 points vs. NKU on 8-12 shooting, 4-4 from free throw line, while adding six assists and four steals. She had 11 points and six assists, including the game-winning dish to Fuehring with 2.5 seconds to go vs. ASU. She recorded nine assists at UTC, which was one shy of her career-high 10 at UK (12/17/17).

JONESIN' FOR MORE JAZZ

Jones has started the last 55 games, the longest streak for the Cardinals. Last year, she started all 39 games, joining Myisha Hines-Allen as the only players to do so. She had a team-high 10 rebounds at Duke. She led the team in scoring for the first time this season with 17 points against UNC. It also tied her career-high of 17 vs. Toledo (11/14/17). She stuffed the stat sheet vs. UK, finishing with 12 points, 6 rebounds, and 4 assists. She is averaging 7.2 points and 5.0 rebounds on the season.

ROAD WARRIORS

The Cards are 5-1 on the road this season and 1-1 in ACC road games. Last season, they went a perfect 8-0 in ACC road games for the second time in three years. They had won 11 straight ACC road games prior to the loss at Notre Dame. They wrapped up road play with a 13-1 record in 2017-18, their best road mark in program history. They finished 12-2 in 2013-14 and 2008-09. Uoft's 13-game road winning streak dating back to 2016-17, which tied the longest road winning streak in program history, came to a close with the 69-58 loss at UConn last season. They also won 13 straight road games from 12/18/15 to 12/21/16. Prior to the defeat to the Huskies, their last road loss was an 85-66 setback at Notre Dame on Feb. 6, 2017, which was also their last ACC road loss. They won their first 11 road games last season, which marked the longest road winning streak in a single season, surpassing the 10-game road winning streak in 2015-16.

PAINT TOUCHES

Louisville has outscored their opponent down low in 13 of 16 games this season, but have been outscored down low in its two of the last three games, at Duke (22-28), at Notre Dame (32-36). They were also outscored down low against Hartford (28-38). They had a season-high 54 points in the paint against UT Martin and are averaging 31.9 per game.

BENCH POINTS

UofL's bench has just 25 combined points (12 vs. ND, 13 vs. GT) in the last two games, which is the smallest production in a two-game stretch this season. The bench outscored Duke 28-5 and UNC 24-3 after recording a season-low six bench points at CMU. Their previous low was 10 vs. UK. They tied a season-high with 45 bench points vs. NKU. They also had 45 against TSU, which eclipsed the 44 against WKU in the opener. The 45 bench points is the most bench points since they had 76 against Murray State on 11/24/17. They are averaging 26.4 bench points.

SHOOK UP

Kylee Shook has two double-doubles this season with 10 points and 11 rebounds vs. UNC and 15 points and 11 rebounds vs. NKU. She has five for her career. She ranks sixth on the team with 7.5 points per game, while shooting 9-21 (429) from downtown and pulling down 5.9 rebounds, which ranks second on the team. After pulling down 12 rebounds in the first four games, she has 76 in the last 12 games. Against TSU, she finished with a career-high 14 rebounds and a program-record eight blocks, while also scoring eight points. She scored a season-high and team-high 17 points, 6-9 from the floor and 1-3 from 3-pt range, vs. Miami (Ohio).

MYKASA PROVIDES SPARK

Mykasa Robinson played pivotal minutes down the stretch at Notre Dame and helped lead a charge that trimmed the lead to two points. She entered the game with nine minutes to go and the Cardinals trailing 62-50. She played the rest of the way and helped UofL go on a 14-4 run to trim the lead to 66-64 with 2:39 to go. She finished with six points on 3-3 shooting and an assist, a block and a steal in 12 minutes. After playing 12 minutes at Notre Dame, she played 18 minutes vs. Georgia Tech. She is averaging 1.9 points, 2.3 rebounds and 11.3 minutes per game.

STREAK ENDS AT 1

Prior to the loss at No. 1 Notre Dame, Louisville was 14-0, which marked the second best start under head coach Jeff Walz, behind only the school-record start of 20-0 in 2017-18. It is the third best start in Louisville history, followed by last season and a 15-0 start in 2006-07.

HOME COURT ADVANTAGE

UofL boasts a 131-15 record (.897) at the KFC Yum! Center. All-time in the venue, UofL holds a plus-22.4 scoring margin. Louisville hit a milestone during the 2016-17 campaign when attendance surpassed the one-million mark for women's basketball games. Through 146 games, Louisville averages 9,298 per contest and has welcomed more than one million fans through the doors of the KFC Yum! Center.

BEST FANS IN THE COUNTRY

Louisville is averaging 8,791 fans per game, which ranks third in the country, after welcoming in 13,786 fans for the Kentucky game, which marked second-highest NCAA attendance this season, behind the 14,625 at Lindsay Whalen's head coaching debut at Minnesota (11/9/18 vs. New Hampshire). They averaged 7,836 fans last season, which ranked fifth in the country, and their 148,887 total fans ranked third.

HEAD COACH JEFF WALZ

Head coach **Jeff Walz**, in his 12th season as a head coach, has compiled a 314-97 (.764) record as the Cardinals' leader. He has led Louisville to eight NCAA Sweet 16 appearances, three trips to Final 4 (2009, 2013, 2018), two of which culminated with NCAA runner-up finishes (2009, 2013). Walz, who is averaging 27.2 wins per season,



became the winningest coach in program history in 2013-14. He also has the most 20-win seasons in school history (10) and the top-seven entries for most victories in a season (36 in 2017-18, 34 in 2008-09; 33 in 2013-14; and 29 in 2012-13 and 2016-17).

Hired on March 27, 2007, the Bluegrass State native took the program to its first NCAA Sweet 16 and it culminated with Louisville earning the No. 12 ranking in the final ESPN/USA Today Coaches Poll. For his efforts, Walz was named the WBCA Maggie Dixon Rookie Coach of the Year.

Prior to taking the reins at Louisville, Walz spent time on four other coaching staffs: Western Kentucky (1996-97), Nebraska (1997-01), Minnesota (2001-02), and Maryland (2002-07). He helped Maryland win the program's first national title in 2006.

WALZ IN THE BIG DANCE

Walz boasts a 27-10 record in NCAA Tournament games, which is 7th all-time in winning percentage and 4th among active coaches. He has directed UofL to a pair of national runner-up finishes (2009, 2013), three Final Fours (2009, 2013, 2018), four Elite Eights (2009, 2013, 2014, 2018), eight trips to the Sweet 16 and 10 NCAA Tournaments.

DURR JOINS THE 2,000 POINT-CLUB

Durr scored 31 points at Central Michigan to enter the 2,000 point club, joining Angel McCoughtry, Shoni Schimmel, and Myisha Hines-Allen. Her 13 points at Duke helped her pass Myisha Hines-Allen for third all-time. Durr was the fifth player in program history to score 1,000 points within their first two years at Louisville.

GOING NITE NITE 300-PLUS TIMES

Asia Durr has 318 3-pointers for her career and is only the second player in program history with 300-plus 3-pointers. She ranks second behind Shoni

Schimmel, who has 387 career 3-pointers. As a sophomore, she connected on 119 3-pointers, which ranked second nationally and set school record. She had 115 3-pointers last season.

Dunham has started the last 14 games after getting her first career start vs. Boise State on 11/19. On the season, she is averaging 7.8 points, which ranks fifth on the team, while shooting 55-97 (.567) from the floor, which ranks eighth in ACC. She had 10 points and seven rebound at Notre Dame. She had 11 points and seven rebounds vs. UK. She had 14 points on 7-10 shooting vs. UTM. Against Miami (Ohio), she finished with a season-high 15 points on 7-10 shooting, while adding a team-high and career-high four steals. She had 11 points on 5-6 shooting vs. Nebraska and 14 points and season-high seven rebounds vs. TSU.

QUARTERLY REPORT

Louisville scored 37 points in the third quarter (37-13) against TSU, which ties the most points in a quarter in school history. They also had 37 points in the second quarter (37-18) against Hartford earlier this season. Prior to this season, the high was 36 points in the third quarter (36-19) vs. Syracuse on 12/29/16. Seven times this season, the Cards have scored more than 30 points in a quarter and 14 times they have scored 25-plus.

I IMITING TURNOVERS

UofL committed just eight turnovers at Notre Dame. In four of last seven games, they have committed less than eight turnovers. They had seven turnovers at CMU a game after committing a season-low five turnovers vs. NKU. That marked the fewest turnovers since they set the school–record and tied the NCAA Tournament record with three vs. Oregon State in the NCAA regional final last March. They have had double-digit turnovers in 12 of 16 games.

SHE WILL BLOCK YOU

Kylee Shook recorded a program-record eight blocks in the 107-52 win over Tennessee State. It broke the previous mark of seven set by Sheronne Vails vs. Houston Baptist on Nov. 17, 2010. She ranks 11th in the ACC with 1.3 blocks per game. She has 104 blocks in her career, which is 10th all-time. Shook's previous career high for blocks in a game was six against Middle Tennessee on Dec. 9, 2017. Last year, Shook finished with 51 blocks, which ranked third all-time in a single season behind only Yuliya Tokova (59, 2006-07) and Angel McCoughtry (56, 2006-07).

70-PLUS

UofL is 216-20 when surpassing the 70-point plateau under Walz. They have scored 70-plus in 13 of 16 games and are 13-0 in those games. UofL scored 70-plus in 27 of 39 games a year ago. The Cardinals were 27-0 when scoring 70-plus last year. They have won 42 straight games when scoring 70-plus points.

50/50

UofL has shot over 50 percent in 8 of 16 games. They shot a season-high .564 (31-55) vs. UK. They are 8-0 in those games. They were 13-0 when shooting 50 percent or better last year. They boast a 106-1 record when shooting 50 percent or better from the field under Walz. Their lone loss came on Nov. 29, 2008 at Nevada when they shot 50.8 percent (L, 85-82).

GIVING UP BIG LEADS

In UofL's win over UNC, the Cards built a 19-point lead in the second quarter (40-21) and led by 17 (40-23) at the half. UNC pulled within two on three occasions before UofL eventually won by seven (73-66). Against UK, Louisville led by 18 points (57-39) with 3:26 to go in the third. UofL led by 17 (71-54) with 7:39 to go before Kentucky went on a 7-0 run and pulled within four on two occasions. Louisville went on to win by five (80-75).

CARDINALS EXCEL IN THE CLASSROOM

The Cardinals achieved a collective 3.264 grade-point average for the 2018 fall semester, the fourth highest GPA in the Jeff Walz era. This marks the ninth straight semester that women's basketball has earned better than a 3.0 cumulative GPA. In addition, 12 student-athletes earned a 3.0 or better GPA, while eight earned Red & Black Scholar Athlete status for a 3.25 or better cumulative GPA. Asia Durr, Lindsey Duvall, Dana Evans and Sam Fuehring were all named to the Dean's List for Fall 2018, earning above a 3.5 GPA. Arica Carter, Durr and Fuehring are all on schedule to graduate in the spring. Carter is working toward her second degree after graduating with a B.S. in Health and Human Performance last December.

RANKED NO. 4 IN AP AND USA TODAY POLS

Louisville is No. 4 in both polls following the 82-88 loss at No. 1 Notre Dame. They moved up to No. 2 in the Associated Press poll and USA Today Coaches Poll after their 73-51 win at Duke. It equaled the highest ranking in program history in both polls. They also moved up to No. 2 in the AP and USA Today following last year's 100-67 win over Notre Dame at the KFC Yum! Center. They were there just a week as they fell at home to Florida State 50-49 the next week. They were also No. 2 in the final USA Today poll in 2009 after falling to UConn, 76-54, in the national title

SUCCESS AGAINST AP TOP 25

Louisville is 2-1 against AP Top 25 teams after the 82-68 loss at No. 1 Notre Dame. Prior, Louisville got a 80-75 win over No. 19 Kentucky and its first win over an AP Top 25 opponent this season with a 58-56 win over No. 19 Arizona State in the South Point Shootout. Their previous Top 25 win was against No. 13 Oregon State in the NCAA Regional Final a year ago. They went 9-3 against Top 25 teams a season ago. In 2016-17, they had five wins over Top 25 teams. In 2017-18, the Cards had four wins over Top 10 teams, the most in program history. With the 100-67 win over No. 2 Notre Dame, the Cards recorded their first win at home against an AP Top 5 team in the Walz era. The Cards are 1-8 at home against AP Top 5 teams under Walz. They are 1-5 against AP Top 5 teams at the KFC Yum! Center (1/11/18 - W vs. No. 2 ND, 100-67; 12/1/16 - L vs. No. 1 UConn, 68-48; 2/7/12 - L vs. No. 3 ND, 66-61, 3/3/14 - L vs. No. 1 UConn, 68-48; 2/7/12 - L vs. No. 3 UConn, 56-46; 11/12/10 - L vs. No. 4 Tennessee, 63-50).

WALZ VS. AP TOP 25

The 80-75 win over No. 19 Kentucky gave Walz his 55th win over an AP Top 25 team and his 43rd in the last nine years. They are 2-1 against AP Top 25 this season.

NONCONFERENCE SUCCESS

Head coach Jeff Walz has compiled an impressive 146-33 record (.816) against nonconference foes in his 12 years at the helm. Last year, UofL went 14-1 in non-conference play, which marked the third time they have recorded just one non-conference loss under Walz. Two times previously - in 2008-09 and 2013-14 - he rolled through nonconference play with just one loss, sporting 13-1 and 12-1 records.

AT THE LINE

Louisville is shooting 75.5 percent from the stripe, which ranks 27th in the nation and fifth in the ACC. They shot a season-low 53.6 percent (15-28) at the free throw line against Kentucky, shooting 5-12 in the fourth quarter.

LOUISVILLE STEALERS

Louisville had 15 steals at Duke, which is the third-most this season. They recorded a season-high 19 steals in the win over TSU. It marked the most steals in a game since they had 24 vs. BYU on March 21, 2015. They had 16 steals in the 95-73 win over Miami (Ohio). At the time, that marked the most steals in a game since they had 16 vs. Bowling Green (W, 83-58) and Lafayette (W, 92-48) in back-to-back games on Nov. 19 and Nov. 20, 2016. Last year, they had a seasonhigh 15 steals vs. Murray State (W, 115-51) on Nov. 24, 2017.

Louisville is 68-24 in January under head coach Jeff Walz.

DURR NAMED ACC PLAYER OF THE WEEK FOR NINTH TIME

Durr was named ACC Player of the Week for the second-consecutive week after averaging 28.5 points per game in wins over UT Martin and in-state rival Kentucky. Durr shot 49 percent from the floor, while averaging 3.0 assists, 3.5 rebounds and 2.0 steals. Against UT Martin, she posted 25 points on 8-of-18 shooting, including 3-of-6 from beyond the arc and 6-of-6 from the foul line, while adding five rebounds, three assists and three steals. She followed that with 32 points on 13-of-25 shooting against Kentucky, opening the game with Louisville's first seven points in route to a 15-point first quarter. She has been named ACC Player of the Week nine times in her career, which is the active ACC leader. She has earned the accolade three times this season, previously being honored on Nov. 12 and Dec. 3. She was named ACC Player of the Week on Dec. 3 after averaging 20.0 points, 4.7 assists and 4.0 rebounds, while shooting 51 percent from the floor, in home wins over Miami (Ohio), Nebraska and Tennessee State. She also earned the honor at the end of the first week of the season after averaging 28.5 points per game in wins at WKU and UTC.

UOFL'S SUCCESS BY DECADES

With Walz at the helm of the program, the Cardinals are averaging 27 victories per season and attained their 800th win (861-488) in program history with the victory over Clemson on Jan. 26, 2017. Louisville has been most successful under Walz's watch and since the 2000s. During the current decade, though not finished, the Cardinals boast a 78.9 winning percentage.

BIG OUARTERS

Louisville opened the Georgia Tech game with a 24-14 after the first quarter and cruised to a 17-point win. 11 first quarter and a 19-12 second quarter to open a 17-point at the half against UNC. They opened the NKU game with a 25-10 first quarter and scored 25-plus in three of four quarters. In the UTM game, they opened with a 31-14 first quarter and a 27-9 second quarter to go into halftime with a 58-23 lead, their largest halftime lead of the year (+35). They outscored TSU by at least nine points in every quarter, but used a 37-13 third quarter to really open the game up. They opened the Miami (Ohio) game with a 27-12 first quarter and outscored the Redhawks by seven the rest of the way. They used a 37-18 second quarter to pull away from Hartford. Hartford outscored Louisville the other three quarters. 51-49 (1st; 16-18; 3rd; 15-15; 4th; 18-18). They used a 21-15 fourth quarter, which included an 8-0 run to squeak out a 58-56 win over Arizona State. At Boise State, they used a 19-3 run to win the third 22-13 to open up the game.

100-PLUS IN TWO STRAIGHT GAMES

UofL scored 107 points in the 107-52 win over TSU, which marked the sixth most points in program history, and followed that with 102 points in the 102-62 win over UTM. It marked first time since 2013-14 that they have scored 100-plus in two straight. They did it twice that season (11/9/13 vs. Loyola Chicago, W 101-54, 11/11/13 vs. Quinnipiac, W 100-82; 12/14/13 vs. Austin Peay, W 108-53; 12/17/13 at

Ball State, W 105-67). It is third time this season they have scored 100-plus as they also did it in the opener at WKU (W, 102-80). Last year, they scored 100-plus points twice, a school-record 115 vs. Murray State on 11/24/17 (W, 115-51) and vs. Notre Dame on 1/11/18 (W, 100-67). UofL is 24-0 all-time when scoring 100-plus.

LOUISVILLE PICKED 2ND IN ACC PRESEASON POLLS

The Cardinals were picked to finish second in both the Atlantic Coast Conference's Blue Ribbon Panel and coaches' polls. Louisville received 870 points from the Blue Ribbon Panel, including three first place votes. Notre Dame was picked to win the title in both polls.

EARLIEST START TO THE SEASON

Louisville opened the season on Nov. 6, which marked the earliest start to the season in program history. The previous earliest start was Nov. 9 in 2012-13 and 2013-14.

ON THE ROAD AGAIN

The Cards have won 151 games away from home since head coach Jeff Walz's arrival in 2007-08. UofL boasts a 152-72 (.679) record in those contests (includes 45-23 record for neutral site games).

■ Last Year: UofL owned an 18-2 record away from the KFC Yum! Center (includes 5-1 neutral record).

WALZ GETS WIN #300 WHERE IT ALL STARTED

Walz recorded his 300th win at WKU where he began his collegiate coaching career. He served as an assistant coach under Paul Sanderford during the 1996-97 season. He helped the team earn an at-large bid to the 1997 NCAA Tournament after going 22-9 to earn a share of the Sun Belt regular-season title. The next season, he moved on to Nebraska after Sanderford was offered the head coaching position.

PRESEASON AP AND USA TODAY RANKINGS

UofL was ranked fifth in the AP 2018-19 preseason poll. The Cardinals were listed on all 31 ballots, receiving 664 points, including one third-place vote. The ranking is tied for the highest preseason position in program history. The Cards were previously slotted fifth before both the 2013-14 and 2016-17 seasons. They remained fifth in the AP. They were rated No. 4 in the USA Today Coaches Poll, which marks the highest preseason ranking in program history. The Cardinals received 687 points, just three points fewer than Oregon, who is rated No. 3. Prior to being ranked No. 4 this season, their highest ranking was No. 5 in 2013-14.

COACHING STAFF CONSISTENCY

For the sixth straight season, Walz has the same assistants with Stephanie Norman (12th year), Sam Williams (8th) and Sam Purcell (6th year). Walz and Norman have been together all 12 seasons.

DIOP OUT FOR SEASON WITH ACL INJURY

Redshirt senior Yacine Diop suffered a season-ending ACL injury (left) vs. Arizona State. She recorded a double-double with 11 points and 10 rebounds in just 18 minutes in her debut as a Cardinal. It marked the 15th double-double of her career. A graduate transfer from Pitt and member of Senegal's national team, Diop led the Panthers with 15.7 points and 6.4 rebounds a year ago. She tied a career high with 26 points against Louisville on Jan. 18. She departed Pitt as the 18th leading scorer of all-time with 1,093 points.

MELTING POT

Louisville's 2018-19 roster continues last year's pattern of being diverse. Of the 13 student-athletes on its roster, eight are from different states (California, Colorado, Florida, Georgia, Indiana, Kentucky, New Jersey, Pennsylvania). Yacine Diop is the only international player and she is from Dakar, Senegal.

DURR NAMED PRESEASON ALL-ACC

Senior guard Asia Durr was selected to the 2018-19 Preseason All-ACC Team, as voted on by the league's coaches and the Blue Ribbon panel. Durr was named ACC Player of the Year last season after leading Louisville to a sweep of ACC regular season and tournament titles. She finished the year averaging 18.7 points, while knocking down 115 3-pointers, which ranked 13th in the country, and shooting 41.5 percent from beyond the arc.

DURR NAMED AP PRESEASON ALL-AMERICAN, WOODEN WATCH LIST

Durr has been selected to the 2018-19 Associated Press Preseason All-America team. Durr was named on 29 of 31 ballots, tying her with Oregon junior Sabrina lonescu for the highest vote total on the team. She was named one of 30 players on Wooden Award Watch List.

DURR RATED NO. 2 ON ESPNW TOP 25 PLAYERS LIST

Asia Durr was listed No. 2 on ESPNW's Top 25 player list behind only Oregon's Sabrina Ionescu. Last season, she was rated No. 7 in the country.

The Naismith Memorial Basketball Hall of Fame announced that Durr is one of 20 watch list candidates for the 2019 Ann Meyers Drysdale Award, while Fuehring is one of 20 watch list candidates for the 2019 Lisa Leslie Award. The Drysdale award recognizes the top shooting guard, while the Leslie award recognizes top center. They were both also recognized on the Citizen Naismith Trophy Award Watch List. As a junior, Fuehring ranked third on the team with 9.9 points and second with 5.4 rebounds. She took a team-high 40 charges and 10 times recorded multiple charges in a game, including six in the win at Ohio State. She was named to the ACC All-Tournament Team, Lexington Regional All-Tournament Team and ACC All-Academic Team.

PAUL SANDERFORD, NORA LYNN FINCH NAMED 2019 WOMEN'S BASKETBALL HALL OF FAME FINALISTS It was announced on Thursday that Paul Sanderford, the former Western Kentucky head coach, and Nora Lynn Finch, the Atlantic Coast Conference Senior Associate Commisioner, Women's Basketball, are both finalists for the 2019 Women's Basketball Hall of Fame. Sanderford, who gave Jeff Walz his start at WKU, spent 25 Seasons as a head coach with a career record of 453-189 (.709). He led Western Kentucky to 12 NCAA Tournament appearances including 3 Final Fours and was the 1992 NCAA Division I National Runner-Up. He also won a JUCO National Championship and was inducted into the NJCAA Hall of Fame in 2000 and into the Western Kentucky University Athletic Hall of Fame in 2008.

A series of short 15-second videos were released throughout the day on social media to raise awareness for Asia25.com, where the University of Louisville will continue to house her National Player of the Year campaign.

EQUALING BEST ACC REGULAR SEASON RECORD

At 15-1 in league play last year, UofL won its first ACC regular season title. The 15-1 record matched best record in ACC as they had same record in 15-16, finished second to Notre Dame.

ANOTHER 20-WIN SEASON

After going 36-3 in 2017-18, head coach Jeff Walz now has 10 20-win seasons in 11 years, adding to what was already the most in school history. In the eight-year stretch that begins with the 2010-11 season, Louisville has compiled a 225-

■ Longest stretch in school history - UofL has won at least 20 games eight consecutive seasons, the longest stretch in program history. The longest run previously was three, achieved just twice in school history.

DURR NAMED ACC PLAYER OF YEAR, WALZ NAMED COACH OF YEAR

Last season, Durr was named ACC Player of the Year by the Blue Ribbon Panel and the Coaches, while Coach Walz was named ACC Coach of the Year by both, as well. Durr was also named ACC Preseason Player of the Year. It marked the second time in three years that a UofL player has won the honor as Myisha Hines-Allen won it as a sophomore in 2015-16. It marks Walz's first Coach of the Year honor.

THIS ONE IS FOUR THE CARDS

Last year, UofL advanced to its third NCAA Final 4 in school history (2009, 2013, 2018) with a 76-43 win over Oregon State. All three Final 4 appearances have occurred in the last 10 years under the guidance of head coach Jeff Walz. They are 2-1 in Final 4 games.

SWEEPING CONFERENCE REGULAR SEASON/TOURNAMENT TITLES

In 2017-18, UofL swept conference regular season and tournament titles for first time since they swept the Metro in 1984. It marked the second time in history that they have won both. It marked their first ACC regular season title and their first regular season conference title since they won C-USA in 2001. It marked their first ACC Tournament title and their first conference tournament title since they won the Metro Tournament in 1993. They have won six regular season titles (1984, 1992, 1997, 1999, 2001, 2018) and six conference tournament titles, the first five in the Metro (1980, 1981, 1983, 1984, 1993, 2018).

WELCOME TO SPORTSCENTER

Asia Durr was one of seven Division I women's basketball players and 10 participants invited to Women's Basketball National Media Day, hosted by the NCAA and ESPN, on ESPN's campus in Bristol, Conn. It marked the second straight year she was invited. Her schedule included a one-on-one sit-down with ESPN sideline reporter Holly Rowe, a fastpaced interview with ESPN analyst Rebecca Lobo, a one-hour press conference with national media, an appearance on the Around the Rim podcast, hosted by LaChina Robinson, and more.

USA USA USA!

Asia Durr, along with former card Angel McCoughtry, has been selected to the 2017-20 USA Basketball Women's National Team Pool, from which the 2018 USA World Cup Team is expected to be selected.. This past summer, Jeff Walz served as head coach of the U19 National Team and led Team USA to a gold medal in Mexico City. Durr also competed in the National 3X3 Tournament at the end of last season.

MY OLD KENTUCKY HOME

UofL added three freshmen, all of which are Kentucky natives, in Seygan Robins (Mercer County, Miss Kentucky Basketball and back-to-back state champion), Mykasa Robinson (Ashland), Molly Lockhart (Louisville Butler), The Cards now have five Kentucky natives on the roster with Lindsey Duvall (Bullitt East) and Jessica Laemmle (Mercy).

CARDINALS WELCOME IN GREEN, KONNO AND PARKER

UofL welcomes in the No. 14 recruiting class in the nation per ESPN HoopGurlz with Nyah Green, a 6-foot-1 guard from Allen, Texas, Ramani Parker, a 6-4 forward from Fresno, Calif., and Norika Konno, a 5-foot-10 guard from Sendai, Japan. It marks the eighth time in the last 10 years that UofL has compiled a top 15 class.

■ Green comes to Louisville as the No. 12-ranked player in the class of 2019, according to espnW HoopGurlz. The five-star prospect is tabbed as the seventh-best player at the guard position. She is ranked seventh overall and as the third-best guard by Prospects Nation. She led Bishop Lynch to a TAPPS 6A state runner-up last season, averaging 18.7 points, 8.0 rebounds and 2.1 assists in 37 games. At the conclusion of the season, she was named TAPPS 1-6A

■ Konno is a 5-foot-10 shooting guard from Seiwa High School in Sendai, Japan, and has an impressive resume of international experience. In early November, she was a member of the Japanese National Team and helped the team win a silver medal at the U18 Women's Asian Championships. She recorded 10-plus points in four of five games, including 19 points on 8-of-12 shooting, vs. China. She finished the tournament averaging 13.0 points, 4.0 rebounds and

■ Parker is a four-star prospect and is ranked 99th overall in the class of 2019, according to espnW HoopGurlz. She is rated No. 13 at the forward position by espnW. She is rated 29th overall and as the seventh-best forward by Prospects Nation. Parker played for Central High School in Fresno, Calif., before transferring to Montverde Academy in Montverde, Fla., for her senior season
