## THE OPENING TIP

### WINNING A SECOND STRAIGHT ACC REGULAR SEASON TITLE

With the 67-40 win at Pitt, the Cardinals concluded ACC play with a 14-2 record and clinched their second consecutive ACC regular season title. It marked the program's seventh ever regular season conference crown and the first time in program history that they have won back-to-back.

### WALZ IN CONFERENCE TOURNAMENTS

UofL is looking to defend its 2018 ACC Tournament title. It marked the first conference tournament title under head coach Jeff Walz. UofL is playing in its third different conference tournament under Walz (Big East, The American, ACC). Since his first season in 2007-08, the Cardinals boast an 19-10 record (.643) and have reached four championship games (2008, 2009, 2014, 2018). UofL went 9-6 in BIG EAST, 2-1 in AAC, and 8-3 in ACC in that span.

### DURR NAMED ACC PLAYER OF THE YEAR FOR SECOND STRAIGHT SEASON

Asia Durr has been named ACC Player of the Year for the second straight season. She is the first player in program history to earn conference player of the year honors multiple times and it marks the third time in four years that a UofL player has earned the honor as Myisha Hines-Allen was named ACC Player of the Year in 2015-16. She was also named First Team All-ACC for the third consecutive season. She has been named to Citizen Naismith Trophy Semifinalist, Wooden Late Season Top 20, Ann Meyers Drysdale Award Top 10 and a Senior CLASS Award Finalist. She ranks second in program history with 2,367 points and 362 made 3-pointers. She is tied for fourth all-time in ACC history in points and is first all-time in 3-pointers made. She is averaging 21.5 points per game, and entered the tourney ranked first in the ACC and 13th in the country. She is connecting on 2.9 3-point field goals per game, which ranked third in the ACC. She is averaging 25.8 points vs. AP Top 25 teams. She is 108-130 (.831) from the free throw line, which ranked sixth in ACC. With 33 points at WKU, 24 at Chattanooga, 20 at Boise State, 20 vs. Hartford, 25 vs. Nebraska, 25 vs. UT Martin, 32 vs. UK, 31 at CMU, 29 at ND, 21 vs. GT, 20 vs. UVA, 29 at FSU, 24 vs. UConn, 34 at Virginia Tech, 23 vs. Boston College, 47 vs. NCST, and 24 vs. Clemson this season, Durr has 14 career 30-point games and 54 career 20-point games. She has scored in double figures in 27 of 28 games.

### EVANS NAMED ACC SIXTH PLAYER OF THE YEAR

Dana Evans was named ACC Sixth Player of the Year. In 16 ACC games, she averaged 10.1 points, while shooting 33-73 (.452) from deep. She had 15 points and five assists, including seven points, on 3-3 shooting, and three assists in the fourth quarter vs. Clemson. She had 15 points, on 3-7 shooting from deep, and six assists vs. NC State. She led team in scoring (13) and assists (6) at Virginia, which marked second time this year she has led team in points and assists. She also led the team in points (21) and assists (6) vs. Northern Kentucky. She has led team in points three times and assists 16 times. She had 20 points, four assists, three rebounds and zero turnovers, while knocking down career-high five 3-pointers (5-10) vs. UConn. She is 30-68 (.441) from deep in last 11 games, was 14-38 (.368) in first 19 games. After starting the first two games, she has come off the bench in 26 of last 28. She is second on the team with 10.6 points and is averaging a team-high 4.1 assists, which ranked 7th in ACC. She is 44-106 (.415) from deep and ranked fourth in the league. She has 124 assists and 56 turnovers and ranked 3rd in ACC with 2.2 assist-to-TO ratio. With eight points and six assists in the win at Pitt, she eclipsed 500 career points and 250 career assists and now has 519 points and 258 assists.

### HISTORIC SENIOR CLASS

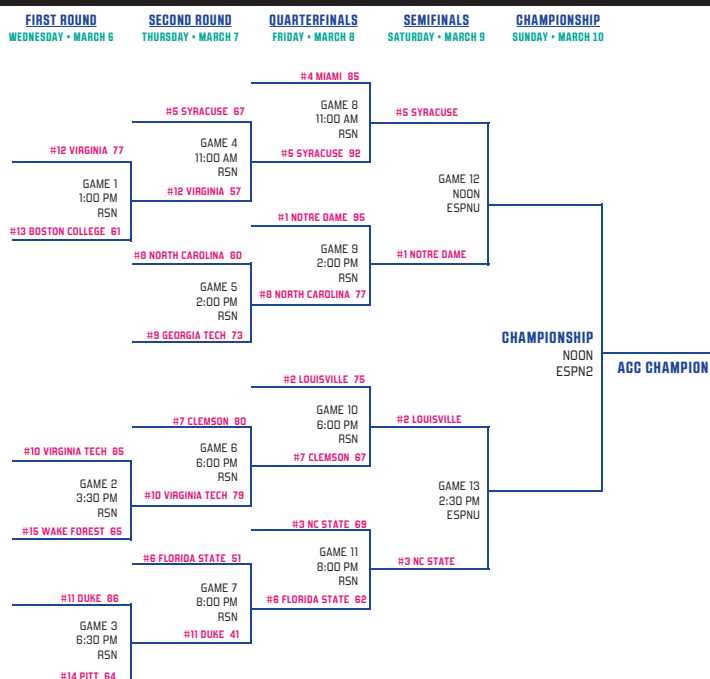
Arica Carter, Asia Durr and Sam Fuehring will go down as one of the most accomplished senior classes in program history. They are 28-2 this season and are 64-5 in the last two seasons combined. Last season, they helped the Cardinals reach the program's third Final Four and put together a program-best 36-3 record. They are 119-21 (.850) overall in the last four years, which is the most wins by a class ever, surpassing Myisha Hines-Allen, who wrapped her career with a 118-26 (.819) record. They are assured to finish their careers with the fewest losses and the best winning percentage in program history.

QUICK HITTERS

- UofL has reached the ACC semifinals in all five ACC Tournaments. They are 1-3 all-time in semis.
- In the last two years, UofL is a combined 64-5. All five losses have come to AP Top 25 teams, three to Top 5 teams.
- Louisville has won 93 consecutive games against non-AP Top 25 teams. Their last loss a 79-66 setback vs. un-ranked Dayton in the Gulf Coast Showcase in Estero, Fla. on Nov. 29, 2015.
- UofL is 15-5 against AP Top 25 teams last two seasons, 6-2 this season; 4-3 against AP Top 5 last two, 1-1 this year.
- Sam Fuehring has 940 career points and is 60 points shy of 1,000.
- With 24 points vs. Clemson, Asia Durr now is tied for fourth all-time in the ACC with 2,367 points.
- Asia Durr's 30 field goal attempts (11-30) marked a career-high.
- Arica Carter scored 10 points vs. Clemson, marking first time since 1/20 at WF where she has scored 10-plus points.
- UofL has trailed just one at halftime this season. They trailed 28-25 at Virginia on 2/21.
- Clemson scored 36 points in the paint, which tied second most points in paint allowed by UofL this season. Hartford had a season-high 38 points in paint on 11/24.

STRONG FOURTH QUARTER

Trailing 60-54 going to the fourth quarter, UofL opened the quarter with a 6-0 run to pull even with 8:32 to go. Ultimately, they won the fourth quarter 21-7 to seal the victory. Dana Evans finished with seven points on 3-3 shooting, while adding three assists in the quarter, while Bionca Dunham had six points and five rebounds. UofL shot 9-17 in the quarter, while limiting Clemson to 3-13 shooting. The Cardinals had six assists on nine buckets in the quarter.

DE-FENSE, DE-FENSE

In ACC games, UofL ranked first in scoring defense (.54.1) and field goal percentage defense (.353), and second in 3-pt field goal percentage defense (.275). UofL's scoring defense has improved from 64.3 to 58.9 points per game and moved from 182 to 51 nationally in the last 15 games. They now also lead the ACC scoring defense for the entire season. During that 15-game stretch, opponents are averaging 53.5 points per game, while shooting .357 from the floor and .299 from 3-point range.

PUTTING UP POINTS

UofL ranks 15th in the country, 2nd in ACC in scoring offense with 79.1 points per game. They have scored 100-plus three times, 90-plus seven times, 80-plus 11 times and 70-plus in 25 of 30 games.

SCORING MARGIN

UofL ranked second in the ACC, seventh in the country with +20.2 scoring margin. Twenty-one wins have been by 17 or more points, 16 by 22-plus points.

SAM I AM

Fuehring is averaging 10.3 points, which ranked third on the team, while shooting 114-210 (.543) from the floor and ranked 10th in the ACC. Her 7.2 rebounds also lead the team. She has 940 career points. She tied a career-high with 14 rebounds, while adding eight points and four assists vs. Clemson. She recorded her fifth double-double of the season and ninth of her career with 12 points and 12 rebounds vs. NC State. She had a career-high 21 points, while pulling down 13 rebounds at Va Tech. She had 10 points and 12 rebounds vs. UConn, 13 points and 14 rebounds vs. Georgia Tech and 14 points and 10 rebounds vs. Nebraska. She had a team-high 18 points and nine rebounds, including the game-winning layup with 2.5 seconds to go vs. Arizona State, then had 19 points, which tied a career-high, and five rebounds vs. Hartford. She was also 8-8 from the line. She had 10 points and 0 rebounds vs. Miami, it marked first time since March 20, 2017 vs. Tennessee in NCAA Tournament that she didn't pull down a rebound. She has scored in double figures in 17 of 30 games. In ACC play, she averaged 9.6 points and 7.3 rebounds.

PROVIDING AN ASSIST

UofL is averaging 17.3 assists per game, which ranked third in ACC and 16th in country. They have double-digit assists in 29 of 30 games. They assisted on 20 on 31 buckets (.645), 20 of 29 buckets (.690) at Pitt and 22 of 27 buckets (.815) vs. Syracuse. Against Georgia Tech, they assisted on 19 of 23 buckets, good for 83 percent. They have assists on 59 percent of their buckets this season.

ANOTHER 20-WIN SEASON

At 28-2, UofL has its 11th 20-win season in the last 12 years. Walz's 11 20-win seasons mark the most in program history. In the nine-year stretch that begins with the 2010-11 season, Louisville has compiled a 253-65 mark (.796).

■ **Longest stretch in school history** - UofL has won at least 20 games nine consecutive seasons, the longest stretch in program history. The longest run previously was three, achieved just twice in school history.

70-PLUS POINTS

UofL is 227-21 when surpassing the 70-point plateau under Walz. They have scored 70-plus in 25 of 30 games and are 24-1 in those games. Their 79-73 loss to Miami ended a 49-game winning streak when scoring 70-plus points. They last lost when scoring 70-plus vs. Notre Dame in ACC Tourney on 3/4/17 (L, 84-73). UofL scored 70-plus in 27 of 39 games a year ago. The Cardinals were 27-0 when scoring 70-plus last year.

50/50

UofL has shot over 50 percent in 12 of 30 games, including a season-best .571 vs. Virginia. They shot .556 at FSU. They are 12-0 in those games. They were 13-0 when shooting 50 percent or better last year. They boast a 110-1 record when shooting 50 percent or better from the field under Walz. Their lone loss came on Nov. 29, 2008 at Nevada when they shot 50.8 percent (L, 85-82).

**MOVING UP LIST FOR MOST WINS**

UofL recorded its 28th win vs. Clemson on Friday, which is the sixth most victories in a single season. Last year, they also won 28 of their first 30 games. The Cards were 29-2 in the regular season last year, which is the most regular season wins in program history. The top six and nine of the 10 top win totals in program history have come with Walz as head coach.

**BALANCED ATTACK**

Seven players are averaging more than 7.4 points and more than 19.3 minutes per game. Seven different players have scored 15-plus points in a game. Prior to the start of the ACC Tournament, nine players had scored in the previous three games vs. BC, NC State and Pitt. Overall, nine players have scored in 13 games this season. At least 11 players have played in 17 of 30 games. For the fourth time this season, at least five players scored in double figures for the Cards at UVA. They also had five in double figures vs. UNC and UK, and six scored in double figures vs. Miami (Ohio). All 11 active players scored in the 91-43 win over Virginia. It marked second time this season as all 11 players scored in the win over TSU.

**Most UofL Victories**

**BIG QUARTERS, BIG RUNS**

The Cardinals outscored Clemson 21-7 in the fourth quarter to secure the 75-67 win on Friday. UofL's 17-5 second quarter helped open up the game at Pitt. They used a 17-0 run to open the NC State game with a 36-13 opening quarter. They outscored the Wolfpack by seven the rest of the way to win 92-62. They opened the Boston College game with a 23-11 first quarter and won three of four quarters by at least nine points. Trailing 28-25 at the half at Virginia, UofL used a 23-9 third quarter to gain control. Overall, they used a 16-0 run to turn a 28-21 deficit into a 37-28 lead. They used a 26-12 second quarter to help build a 20-point lead at Va Tech before hanging on to a nine-point win. They opened vs. Syracuse with a 10-2 and 18-4 lead and led 30-17 after the first quarter. After falling behind 4-0, they used an 18-0 run to pull ahead of Clemson 18-4 and finished the first quarter with 20-10 lead. They then used a 32-6 run that began late in the second quarter and stretched into the final period. They outscored the Tigers 17-5 in the third and 24-12 in the fourth for a 41-17 second half advantage. They used a 23-6 first quarter and 18-6 second quarter to open a 41-12 halftime lead over Pitt. The 12 points at half were the fewest allowed all season. They utilized a 20-6 first quarter to open up the game at FSU and led the rest of the way. Against Virginia, they used a 31-9 second quarter to turn a 15-14 lead into a 46-20 lead at halftime. Ultimately, after leading 15-14 with 9:46 to go in the second quarter, they went on a 50-10 run to lead 65-24 with 3:28 to go in the third. They then outscored the Cavs 25-10 in the third en route to an ACC record 48-point rout. In the UTM game, they opened with a 31-14 first quarter and a 27-9 second quarter to go into halftime with a 58-23 lead, their largest halftime lead of the year (+35). They used a 37-18 second quarter to pull away from Hartford. Hartford outscored Louisville the other three quarters, 51-49 (1st: 16-18; 3rd: 15-15; 4th: 18-18).

**HOLDING OPPONENTS TO LESS THAN 50 POINTS**

Louisville held Pitt to a season-low 40 points in their 67-40 win. Overall, UofL has held opponents below 50 points in eight of last 15 games. Prior to giving up 69 points to UConn, UofL held opponents to less than 50 points a program record five straight games (vs. GT - W, 61-44; vs. UVA - W, 91-43; at WF - W, 73-49; at FSU - W, 68-49; vs. Pitt - W, 70-42). The previous record was a four-game stretch during the first season on record from Feb. 20-March 1, 1976 (vs. Murray State - W, 42-39; vs. Xavier - W, 69-29; vs. Georgetown - W, 94-46; vs. Morehead State - W, 67-46). Prior to the stretch of eight of 15 games, UofL had held an opponent below 50 points just once (at UTC - W, 75-49).

**SINGLE DIGIT SCORING QUARTERS**

UofL held Clemson to seven fourth quarter points to come back from six points down and win. They held Pitt to five points in the second quarter, which equaled the lowest point total in a quarter by an opponent this season. At Clemson, they held the Tigers to zero field goals and five points in the third quarter. In the first game against Pitt, they held the Panthers to six points in both the first and second quarters. They held Pitt to 3-21 (.143) shooting in the first half. They have held opponents to at least one single digit scoring quarter in 10 of last 15 games. Overall, they have held opponents to 15 single digit scoring quarters this season. Last season, UofL held opponents to a program-record 32 single digit scoring quarters, including holding NC State to a program-record one point in the first quarter on 12/31/17.

**B BRINGER HER "A" GAME**

Dunham has started the last 28 games after getting her first career start vs. Boise State on 11/19. On the season, she is averaging 7.5 points, while shooting 101-174 (.580) from the floor and ranked sixth in ACC. She had eight points and seven rebounds vs. Clemson. She had 10 points on 5-9 shooting at Virginia and 12 points on 6-7 shooting, while adding eight rebounds vs. Miami. She had eight points and seven rebounds vs. UConn after pulling down a season-high eight rebounds vs. Pitt. She had 12 points and five rebounds vs. Virginia and 10 points and seven rebounds at Notre Dame. She had 11 points and seven rebounds vs. UK. Against Miami (Ohio), she finished with a season-high 15 points on 7-10 shooting, while adding a team-high and career-high four steals.

**TURN UP THE ACC**

Carter scored 10 points vs. Clemson to reach double figures for first time since Jan. 20 at Wake. She scored in double figures in four of the first six ACC games, but failed to do so in the final 10. In ACC play, she averaged 8.8 points, while shooting 32-83 (.386) from downtown. In the win at Wake Forest, she knocked down three 3-pointers early and led the team with 12 points on 4-7 shooting from deep. Against Duke, she knocked down three 3-pointers in the first couple minutes to help the Cardinals jump out to an 11-2 lead. She finished the game with a career-high 23 points, while connecting on a career-high seven 3-pointers, going 7-10 from beyond the arc. She ranks fourth on team with 8.6 points per game and is shooting 56-143 (.392) from distance, which ranked eighth in the ACC. She has started 26 of 30 games this season. She didn't start vs. WKU, which ended a stretch of 64 straight starts in games that she has played. Last season, she started all 38 games she played. She missed the 2016-17 season with a groin injury. Last season, she shot 38.6 percent from 3-point range and connected on 49 3-pointers after entering the season with a career 16 made threes. She did not make a 3-pointer as a freshman.

**SHOOK UP**

Shook has failed to reach double figures in last three games following a stretch of scoring in double figures in four of five games. She had 14 points on 2-2 shooting from deep, while adding seven rebounds and two blocks vs. Boston College. She had 10 points on 4-5 shooting at Virginia, 12 points and six rebounds, while tying a career-high with four made 3-pointers (4-5) vs. Miami. She also had four threes vs. Notre Dame in the ACC Tourney on 3/4/17. She recorded her third double-double of the year, and sixth of career, with 12 points and 11 rebounds vs. Syracuse. She had 10 points and 11 rebounds vs. UNC and 15 points and 11 rebounds vs. NKU for her other two double-doubles. She pulled down a career-high 15 rebounds, while adding four points, three assists, three blocks and two steals at Clemson. She had 12 points and seven boards vs. Pitt after finishing with eight points, nine rebounds and five blocks at FSU. She ranks sixth on the team with 7.4 points per game, while pulling down 6.2 rebounds, which ranks second. In ACC games, she averaged 8.3 points and 7.0 rebounds. Against TSU, she finished with 14 rebounds and a program-record eight blocks. She scored a season-high and team-high 17 points, 6-9 from the floor and 1-3 from 3-pt range, vs. Miami (Ohio).

**SHE WILL BLOCK YOU**

Kylee Shook had five blocks at FSU. She recorded a program-record eight blocks in the 107-52 win over Tennessee State. It broke the previous mark of seven set by Sheronne Vails vs. Houston Baptist on Nov. 17, 2010. She ranked seventh in the ACC with 1.5 blocks per game. She has 131 blocks in her career, which is tied for third all-time in program history with Nell Knox (1989-93). Shook's previous career high for blocks in a game was six against Middle Tennessee on Dec. 9, 2017. Last year, Shook has 46 blocks this year. Last year, she finished with 51 blocks, which ranked third all-time in a single season behind only Yuliya Tokova (59, 2006-07) and Angel McCoughtry (56, 2006-07).

**HEAD COACH JEFF WALZ**

Head coach Jeff Walz, in his 12th season as a head coach, has compiled a 327-98 (.769) record as the Cardinals' leader. He has led Louisville to eight NCAA Sweet 16 appearances, three trips to Final 4 (2009, 2013, 2018), two of which culminated with NCAA runner-up finishes (2009, 2013). Walz, who is averaging 27.2 wins per season, became the winningest coach in program history in 2013-14. He also has the most 20-win seasons in school history (10) and the top-seven entries for most victories in a season (36 in 2017-18, 34 in 2008-09; 33 in 2013-14; and 29 in 2012-13 and 2016-17).



Hired on March 27, 2007, the Bluegrass State native took the program to its first NCAA Sweet 16 and it culminated with Louisville earning the No. 12 ranking in the final ESPN/USA Today Coaches Poll. For his efforts, Walz was named the WBCA Maggie Dixon Rookie Coach of the Year.

Prior to taking the reins at Louisville, Walz spent time on four other coaching staffs: Western Kentucky (1996-97), Nebraska (1997-01), Minnesota (2001-02), and Maryland (2002-07). He helped Maryland win the program's first national title in 2006.

WALZ IN THE BIG DANCE

Walz boasts a 27-10 record in NCAA Tournament games, which is 7th all-time in winning percentage and 4th among active coaches. He has directed UofL to a pair of national runner-up finishes (2009, 2013), three Final Fours (2009, 2013, 2018), four Elite Eights (2009, 2013, 2014, 2018), eight trips to the Sweet 16 and 10 NCAA Tournaments.

DURR JOINS THE 2,000 POINT-CLUB

Durr scored 31 points at Central Michigan to enter the 2,000 point club, joining Angel McCoughtry, Shoni Schimmel, and Myisha Hines-Allen. Her 12 points at Clemson helped her pass Schimmel for second all-time. Durr was the fifth player in program history to score 1,000 points within their first two years at Louisville.

GOING NITE NITE 300-PLUS TIMES

Asia Durr has 362 3-pointers for her career and is only the second player in program history with 300-plus 3-pointers. She ranks second behind Schimmel, who has 387 career 3-pointers. As a sophomore, she connected on 119 3-pointers, which ranked second nationally and set school record. She had 115 3-pointers last season.

DURR REWRITING ACC RECORD BOOKS

Asia Durr's 362 made 3-pointers is the most all-time in the ACC and her 2,367 points are tied for fourth all-time.

DURR GOES SENIOR NITE NITE

Asia Durr tied her own program-record with 47 points and knocked down an ACC record 11 3-pointers in the 92-62 win over No. 10 NC State. The previous ACC record for threes in a game was 10 by Stephanie Watts of North Carolina vs. Charleston Southern on Nov. 22, 2016. The previous UofL record for threes in a game was nine by Asia Durr at No. 5 Ohio State on Nov. 12, 2017 and Shoni Schimmel vs. Memphis on Jan. 26, 2014. Durr scored 47 points on 17-27 shooting from the floor, while going 11-17 from 3-point range. She opened the game with 22 points in the first quarter, while shooting 8-11 from the floor and 6-8 from deep. Her 17 field goals also tied the program record for the most made in a game. She previously scored 47 points in the 95-90 overtime win at No. 5 Ohio State a season ago. Durr's 47 points also eclipses the men's basketball single game scoring record, which is 45 points by Wes Unseld vs. Georgetown on Dec. 1, 1967.

DURR FROM DEEP

Durr has connected on at least one 3-pointer in 28 of 29 games. She didn't knock down a 3-pointer (0-7) in the win over UNC. She had connected on at least one 3-pointer in 17 straight games. It marked first time that Durr hadn't hit a 3-pointer since she went 0-4 vs. Boise State in the first round of the NCAA Tournament on 3/16/18. She owns the school-record of 59 straight games (3/15-1/25/18) with a 3-pointer. The previous record was 36 by Sara Nord (2/8/02-3/6/03).

DURR DROPS DIMES

Durr ranked ninth in the ACC with a 1.7 assist-to-TO ratio. After leading the team with five assists vs. Miami, she has led the team in assists seven times this year and 20 times in her career. She dropped a career-high and team-high eight assists, five of which came in the fourth quarter, against Nebraska. Her previous career-high was seven assists vs. Syracuse on 2/4/18. She ranks second on the team with 3.2 assists. Last year she averaged 2.3 assists.

DURR NAMED ESPNW PLAYER OF THE WEEK

Asia Durr was named espnW Player of the Week after scoring 24 points on 5-10 shooting from beyond the arc as she helped the Cardinals down No. 2 UConn 78-69 at the KFC Yum! Center in front of 17,000-plus fans. It marked the third time in her career, and the first this season, that she has been named espnW Player of the Week.

BENCH POINTS

They outscored UVA's bench 43-14, which was just shy of a season-high 45 bench points vs. NKU and TSU. Last season, they had 76 bench points against Murray State on 11/24/17. They are averaging 24.0 bench points per game and have outscored opponents' bench in 25 games (23-2).

LOOKING TO SWEEP CONFERENCE REGULAR SEASON/TOURNAMENT TITLES...AGAIN

After claiming their second straight regular season ACC title, UofL seeks to sweep regular season and tournament titles in consecutive seasons. Last year they swept titles for the first time since they swept the Metro in 1984. Those two seasons are the only times in program history where they have won both. They have won seven regular season titles (1984, 1992, 1997, 1999, 2001, 2018, 2019) and six conference tournament titles, the first five in the Metro (1980, 1981, 1983, 1984, 1993, 2018).

JONESIN' FOR MORE JAZ

Jazmine Jones has started the last 69 games, the longest streak for the Cardinals. Last year, she started all 39 games, joining Myisha Hines-Allen as the only players to do so. She had 12 points, 3 rebounds and 3 assists at Pitt. She tied a career-high with 17 points and knocked down a career-high three 3-pointers (3-3) in win at Clemson. She is 9-32 (.281) from deep for her career. She recorded her first double-double of the season and second of her career with 13 points and 12 rebounds vs. UConn. She had eight points, four rebounds and two steals in her return home to Tallahassee and had a career-high eight assists at Wake Forest. She led the team in scoring for the first time this season with 17 points against UNC. She also had 17 vs. Toledo (11/14/17). She is averaging 7.4 points and 4.7 rebounds on the season.

PAINT TOUCHES

Louisville has outscored their opponent down low in 23 of 30 games this season. They tied Clemson down low at 36-36. They outscored Pitt 36-16 in the paint. They had a season-high 54 points in the paint against UT Martin and are averaging 30.1 per game.

RANKED NO. 3 IN AP AND USA TODAY POLS

Louisville holds at No. 3 in both polls for the second straight week following wins over No. 10 NC State and at Pitt. They moved up to No. 2 for the second time this season following wins over No. 2 UConn and at Clemson. They also moved up to No. 2 in both polls after their win at Duke. It equaled the highest ranking in program history in both polls. They also moved up to No. 2 in the AP and USA Today following last year's 100-67 win over Notre Dame at the KFC Yum! Center. They were there just a week as they fell at home to Florida State 50-49 the next week. They were also No. 2 in the final USA Today poll in 2009 after falling to UConn, 76-54, in the national title game.

STAYING IN THE TOP FIVE

Louisville has remained in the AP Top 5 for 36 consecutive weeks (Nov. 13, 2017-pres) and the USA Today Top 5 for 35 consecutive weeks (Nov. 27, 2017-pres).

SUCCESS AGAINST AP TOP 25

Louisville is 6-2 against AP Top 25 teams this season with wins over No. 22 Florida State, No. 19 Kentucky, No. 19 Arizona State, No. 2 Connecticut, No. 15 Syracuse, and No. 10 NC State and losses at No. 1 Notre Dame and to No. 20 Miami. The win over No. 2 UConn marked their second straight win over a top 5 team at the KFC Yum! Center, following last season's win over No. 2 Notre Dame. The Cards are now 2-8 at home against AP Top 5 teams under Walz. They are 2-5 against AP Top 5 teams at the KFC Yum! Center (1/31/18 - W vs. No. 2 UConn, 78-69; 1/11/18 - W vs. No. 2 ND, 100-67; 12/1/16 - L vs. No. 5 Maryland, 78-72; 2/7/16 - L vs. No. 3 ND, 66-61; 3/3/14 - L vs. No. 1 UConn, 68-48; 2/7/12 - L vs. No. 3 UConn, 56-46; 11/12/10 - L vs. No. 4 Tennessee, 63-50).

AGAINST AP TOP 25 IN 2017-18

UofL went 9-3 against Top 25 teams a season ago. The Cards had four wins over Top 10 teams last year, the most in program history. With the 100-67 win over No. 2 Notre Dame, the Cards recorded their first win at home against an AP Top 5 team in the Walz era.

WALZ VS. AP TOP 25

Walz has 59 wins over AP Top 25 teams and 47 in the last nine years.



NONCONFERENCE SUCCESS

The Cardinals are undefeated in non-conference play (13-0) this season and it will mark the first time in program history that they finish regular season play unbeaten out of league play. Head coach Jeff Walz has compiled an impressive 147-33 record (.817) against nonconference foes in his 12 years at the helm. Last year, UofL went 14-1 in non-conference play, which marked the third time they have recorded just one non-conference loss under Walz. Two times previously - in 2008-09 and 2013-14 - he rolled through nonconference play with just one loss, sporting 13-1 and 12-1 records.

ROAD WARRIORS

The Cards are 11-1 on the road this season and 7-1 in ACC road games. Last season, they went a perfect 8-0 in ACC road games for the second time in three years. They had won 11 straight ACC road games prior to the loss at Notre Dame. Prior to the defeat to the Irish, their last ACC road loss was an 85-66 setback at Notre Dame on Feb. 6, 2017. They wrapped up road play with a 13-1 record in 2017-18, their best road mark in program history. They won their first 11 road games last season, which marked the longest road winning streak in a single season, surpassing the 10-game road winning streak in 2015-16.

ON THE ROAD AGAIN

The Cards have won 159 games away from home since head coach Jeff Walz's arrival in 2007-08. UofL boasts a 159-72 (.688) record in those contests (includes 46-23 record for neutral site games).

- **This Year:** UofL owns an 14-1 record away from the KFC Yum! Center (includes 3-0 neutral record).
- **Last Year:** UofL owned an 18-2 record away from the KFC Yum! Center (includes 5-1 neutral record).

MYKASA PROVIDES SPARK

Mykasa Robinson pulled down five rebounds in just 15 minutes at Virginia. She scored a season-high seven points, while recording three steals, in 19 minutes at Wake Forest. She played a season-high 20 minutes in wins over Virginia and at Wake Forest. She played pivotal minutes down the stretch at Notre Dame and helped lead a charge that trimmed the lead to two points. She entered the game with nine minutes to go and the Cardinals trailing 62-50. She played the rest of the way and helped UofL go on a 14-4 run to trim the lead to 66-64 with 2:39 to go. She finished with six points on 3-3 shooting and an assist, a block and a steal in 12 minutes.

QUARTERLY REPORT

Louisville scored 36 points in the first quarter vs. NC State, which marked the most points in the first quarter this season. They scored 37 points in the third quarter (37-13) against TSU, which tied the most points in a quarter in school history. They also had 37 points in the second quarter (37-18) against Hartford earlier this season. Prior to this season, the high was 36 points in the third quarter (36-19) vs. Syracuse on 12/29/16. Ten times this season, the Cards have scored 30-plus points in a quarter and 19 times they have scored 25-plus.

STREAK ENDS AT 14

Prior to the loss at No. 1 Notre Dame, Louisville was 14-0, which marked the second best start under head coach Jeff Walz, behind only the school-record start of 20-0 in 2017-18. It is the third best start in Louisville history, followed by last season and a 15-0 start in 2006-07.

TAKING DOWN UCONN

Louisville's 78-69 win over No. 2 UConn marked their first win over the Huskies since a 74-71 win in the first round of the NCAA Tournament on March 17, 1993 in Storrs, Conn. The win ended a 17-game losing streak to UConn as they entered the game with a 1-17 record. It also marked Walz's first win (1-14) against UConn.

BEST FANS IN THE COUNTRY

Louisville is averaging 9,847 fans per game and have a 147,703 accumulative attendance this season, both of which rank third in the country. It marks third highest average attendance at the KFC Yum! Center and the highest since they averaged 10,670 in 2011-12 and 10,859 in 2010-11. They welcomed in 17,023 fans for the win over UConn, which is the third largest women's basketball crowd this season and fourth biggest crowd for a women's basketball game at the KFC Yum! Center. They have three of the top eight crowds in all of women's basketball this season. Overall, they have welcomed in 10,000-plus seven times this season and in six of last eight home games (13,786 vs. Kentucky ranks fifth this season, 12,193 vs. Miami ranks eighth this season, 10,514 vs. Georgia Tech, 10,067 vs. Pitt, 11,132 vs. BC, 10,602 vs. NCST). The seven 10,000-plus crowds games mark the second-most in history. They had eight 10,000-plus crowds in 2011-12. They averaged 7,836 fans last season, which ranked fifth in the country, and their 148,887 total fans ranked third.

ATTENDANCE VS. THE MEN

With 9,847 fans per game, the Louisville women are outdrawing 10 of 15 ACC men's teams. Louisville would rank 42nd in the nation in men's attendance.

HOME COURT ADVANTAGE

UofL boasts a 137-16 record (.895) at the KFC Yum! Center and its 18-game winning streak came to a close vs. Miami. All-time in the venue, UofL holds a plus-22.5 scoring margin. Louisville hit a milestone during the 2016-17 campaign when attendance surpassed the one-million mark for women's basketball games. Through 153 games, Louisville averages 9,379 per contest and has welcomed more than one million fans through the doors of the KFC Yum! Center.

BIGGEST WIN IN ACC HISTORY

UofL's 48-point win (W, 91-43) over Virginia marked its biggest margin of victory in ACC history. The previous record was a 42-point win (W, 71-33) vs. Clemson on Jan. 28, 2016. They also held Virginia to just one free throw (1-4) which marked the fewest amount of free throws allowed since Clemson had just one free in same game (1-6).

ON THE BOARDS

UofL outrebounded Clemson 39-35 and Pitt 42-29 and has outrebounded their opponent in 18 (18-0) of 30 games.

MARCH MADNESS

Louisville is 47-23 in the month of March under head coach Jeff Walz.

**UOFL'S SUCCESS BY DECADES**

With Walz at the helm of the program, the Cardinals are averaging 27 victories per season and attained their 800th win (874-489) in program history with the victory over Clemson on Jan. 26, 2017. Louisville has been most successful under Walz's watch and since the 2000s. During the current decade, though not finished, the Cardinals boast a 79.6 winning percentage.

**LOUISVILLE STEALERS**

UoFL had just two steals vs. Clemson. Prior, they had 43 steals combined in the previous four games, with 11 at UVA and at BC, nine vs. NCST and 12 at Pitt. They had 15 steals at Duke, which is the third-most this season. They recorded a season-high 19 steals in the win over TSU. It marked the most steals in a game since they had 24 vs. BYU on March 21, 2015. They had 16 steals in the 95-73 win over Miami (Ohio). At the time, that marked the most steals in a game since they had 16 vs. Bowling Green (W, 83-58) and Lafayette (W, 92-48) in back-to-back games on Nov. 19 and Nov. 20, 2016. Last year, they had a season-high 15 steals vs. Murray State (W, 115-51) on Nov. 24, 2017.

**100-PLUS IN TWO STRAIGHT GAMES**

UoFL scored 107 points in the 107-52 win over TSU, which marked the sixth most points in program history, and followed that with 102 points in the 102-62 win over UTM. It marked first time since 2013-14 that they have scored 100-plus in two straight. They did it twice that season (11/9/13 vs. Loyola Chicago, W 101-54, 11/11/13 vs. Quinnipiac, W 100-82; 12/14/13 vs. Austin Peay, W 108-53; 12/17/13 at Ball State, W 105-67). It is third time this season they have scored 100-plus as they also did it in the opener at WKU (W, 102-80). Last year, they scored 100-plus points twice, a school-record 115 vs. Murray State on 11/24/17 (W, 115-51) and vs. Notre Dame on 1/11/18 (W, 100-67). UoFL is 24-0 all-time when scoring 100-plus.

**DURR NAMED ACC PLAYER OF THE WEEK FOR NINTH TIME**

Durr was named ACC Player of the Week for the second-consecutive week after averaging 28.5 points per game in wins over UT Martin and in-state rival Kentucky. Durr shot 49 percent from the floor, while averaging 3.0 assists, 3.5 rebounds and 2.0 steals. Against UT Martin, she posted 25 points on 8-of-18 shooting, including 3-of-6 from beyond the arc and 6-of-6 from the foul line, while adding five rebounds, three assists and three steals. She followed that with 32 points on 13-of-25 shooting against Kentucky, opening the game with Louisville's first seven points in route to a 15-point first quarter. She has been named ACC Player of the Week nine times in her career, which is the active ACC leader. She has earned the accolade three times this season, previously being honored on Nov. 12 and Dec. 3. She was named ACC Player of the Week on Dec. 3 after averaging 20.0 points, 4.7 assists and 4.0 rebounds, while shooting 51 percent from the floor, in home wins over Miami (Ohio), Nebraska and Tennessee State. She also earned the honor at the end of the first week of the season after averaging 28.5 points per game in wins at WKU and UTC.

**DIOP OUT FOR SEASON WITH ACL INJURY**

Redshirt senior Yacine Diop suffered a season-ending ACL injury (left) vs. Arizona State. She recorded a double-double with 11 points and 10 rebounds in just 18 minutes in her debut as a Cardinal. It marked the 15th double-double of her career. A graduate transfer from Pitt and member of Senegal's national team, Diop led the Panthers with 15.7 points and 6.4 rebounds a year ago. She tied a career high with 26 points against Louisville on Jan. 18. She departed Pitt as the 18th leading scorer of all-time with 1,093 points.

**CARDINALS EXCEL IN THE CLASSROOM**

The Cardinals achieved a collective 3.264 grade-point average for the 2018 fall semester, the fourth highest GPA in the Jeff Walz era. This marks the ninth straight semester that women's basketball has earned better than a 3.0 cumulative GPA. In addition, 12 student-athletes earned a 3.0 or better GPA, while eight earned Red & Black Scholar Athlete status for a 3.25 or better cumulative GPA. Asia Durr, Lindsey Duval, Dana Evans and Sam Fuehring were all named to the Dean's List for Fall 2018, earning above a 3.5 GPA. Arica Carter, Durr and Fuehring are all on schedule to graduate in the spring. Carter is working toward her second degree after graduating with a B.S. in Health and Human Performance last December.

**WALZ GETS WIN #300 WHERE IT ALL STARTED**

Walz recorded his 300th win at WKU where he began his collegiate coaching career. He served as an assistant coach under Paul Sanderford during the 1996-97 season. He helped the team earn an at-large bid to the 1997 NCAA Tournament after going 22-9 to earn a share of the Sun Belt regular-season title. The next season, he moved on to Nebraska after Sanderford was offered the head coaching position.

**GREEN NAMED McDONALD'S ALL-AMERICAN**

University of Louisville women's basketball signee Nyah Green was named a McDonald's All-American on Thursday afternoon. The 42nd annual McDonald's All-American Girls Game is scheduled to tip Wednesday, March 27 at 5 p.m. ET from State Farm Arena in Atlanta. Green comes to Louisville as the No. 12-ranked player in the class of 2019, according to ESPNW HoopGuriz. The five-star prospect is tabbed as the seventh-best player at the guard position. She is ranked seventh overall and as the third-best guard by Prospects Nation. Green is joined in the class by Ramani Parker, a 6-4 forward from Fresno, Calif., and Norika Konno, a 5-foot-10 guard from Sendai, Japan. Asia Durr, Sam Fuehring, Kylee Shook and Dana Evans were all named McDonald's All-Americans prior to signing with Louisville.

**FUEHRING NAMED SOUTH POINT SHOOTOUT ALL-TOURNEY TEAM**

Fuehring was named to the South Point Shootout All-Tournament team after averaging 18.5 points and seven rebounds in wins over Arizona State and Hartford.

**LOUISVILLE PICKED 2ND IN ACC PRESEASON POLLS**

UoFL picked to finish 2nd in both the Atlantic Coast Conference's Blue Ribbon Panel and coaches' polls. UoFL received 870 points from the Blue Ribbon Panel, including three first place votes. Notre Dame was picked to win the title in both polls.

**RETURNING POINT PRODUCTION**

UoFL returned 60.8 points per game, 79% of their production from a year ago.

**RETURNING STARTERS**

The Cardinals return four from a year ago (Carter, Durr, Fuehring, Jones). The quartet combined for 45.1 points. The rest of the returning roster combined for 15.5 points in 2017-18, led by Dana Evans' 5.1 points per game. Overall, the Cardinals return players with 240 career starts prior to this season, led by Durr's 76 career starts, while Carter ranks second with 68.

**PRESEASON AP AND USA TODAY RANKINGS**

UofL was ranked fifth in the AP 2018-19 preseason poll. The Cards were listed on all 31 ballots, receiving 664 points, including one third-place vote. The ranking is tied for the highest preseason position in program history. The Cards were previously slotted fifth before both the 2013-14 and 2016-17 seasons. They were rated No. 4 in the USA Today Coaches Poll, which marks the highest preseason ranking in program history. The Cardinals received 687 points, just three points fewer than Oregon, who is rated No. 3. Prior to being ranked No. 4 this season, their highest ranking was No. 5 in 2013-14.

**COACHING STAFF CONSISTENCY**

For the sixth straight season, Walz has the same assistants with Stephanie Norman (12th year), Sam Williams (8th) and Sam Purcell (6th year). Walz and Norman have been together all 12 seasons.

**MELTING POT**

Louisville's 2018-19 roster continues last year's pattern of being diverse. Of the 13 student-athletes on its roster, eight are from different states (California, Colorado, Florida, Georgia, Indiana, Kentucky, New Jersey, Pennsylvania). Yacine Diop is the only international player and she is from Dakar, Senegal.

**DURR NAMED PRESEASON ALL-ACC**

Senior guard Asia Durr was selected to the 2018-19 Preseason All-ACC Team, as voted on by the league's coaches and the Blue Ribbon panel. Durr was named ACC Player of the Year last season after leading Louisville to a sweep of ACC regular season and tournament titles. She finished the year averaging 18.7 points, while knocking down 115 3-pointers, which ranked 13th in the country, and shooting 41.5 percent from beyond the arc.

**DURR NAMED AP PRESEASON ALL-AMERICAN, WOODEN WATCH LIST**

Durr has been selected to the 2018-19 Associated Press Preseason All-American team. Durr was named on 29 of 31 ballots, tying her with Oregon junior Sabrina Ionescu for the highest vote total on the team. She was named one of 30 players on Wooden Award Watch List.

**DURR RATED NO. 2 ON ESPNW TOP 25 PLAYERS LIST**

Asia Durr was listed No. 2 on ESPNW's Top 25 player list behind only Oregon's Sabrina Ionescu. Last season, she was rated No. 7 in the country.

**DURR NAMED TO MEYERS DRYSDALE AWARD WATCH LIST; FUEHRING NAMED TO LESLIE AWARD WATCH LIST; BOTH NAMED TO NAISMITH TROPHY AWARD WATCH LIST**

The Naismith Memorial Basketball Hall of Fame announced that Durr is one of 20 watch list candidates for the 2019 Ann Meyers Drysdale Award, while Fuehring is one of 20 watch list candidates for the 2019 Lisa Leslie Award. The Drysdale award recognizes the top shooting guard, while the Leslie award recognizes top center. They were both also recognized on the Citizen Naismith Trophy Award Watch List. As a junior, Fuehring ranked third on the team with 9.9 points and second with 5.4 rebounds. She took a team-high 40 charges and 10 times recorded multiple charges in a game, including six in the win at Ohio State. She was named to the ACC All-Tournament Team, Lexington Regional All-Tournament Team and ACC All-Academic Team.

**LOUISVILLE UNVEILS ASIA25.COM**

The University of Louisville announced the unveiling of Asia25.com, a new website to promote senior guard Asia Durr for National Player of the Year. U of L launched the website by telling the story of Durr – her journey to Louisville and the accomplishments she has already achieved. A series of short 15-second videos were released throughout the day on social media to raise awareness for Asia25.com, where the University of Louisville will continue to house her National Player of the Year campaign.

**DURR NAMED ACC PLAYER OF YEAR, WALZ NAMED COACH OF YEAR**

Last season, Durr was named ACC Player of the Year by the Blue Ribbon Panel and the Coaches, while Coach Walz was named ACC Coach of the Year by both, as well. Durr was also named ACC Preseason Player of the Year. It marked the second time in three years that a UofL player has won the honor as Myisha Hines-Allen won it as a sophomore in 2015-16. It marks Walz's first Coach of the Year honor.

**THIS ONE IS FOUR THE CARDS**

Last year, UofL advanced to 3rd NCAA Final 4 (2009, 2013, 2018) with a 76-43 win over Oregon State. All three Final 4 appearances have occurred in the last 10 years under the guidance of head coach Jeff Walz. They are 2-1 in Final 4 games.

**WELCOME TO SPORTSCENTER**

Asia Durr was one of seven Division I women's basketball players and 10 participants invited to Women's Basketball National Media Day, hosted by the NCAA and ESPN, on ESPN's campus in Bristol, Conn. It marked the second straight year she was invited. Her schedule included a one-on-one sit-down with ESPN sideline reporter Holly Rowe, a fast-paced interview with ESPN analyst Rebecca Lobo, an appearance on the Around the Rim podcast, hosted by LaChina Robinson, and more.

**USA USA USA!**

Asia Durr, along with former card Angel McCoughtry, has been selected to the 2017-20 USA Basketball Women's National Team Pool, from which the 2018 USA World Cup Team is expected to be selected.. This past summer, Jeff Walz served as head coach of the U19 National Team and led Team USA to a gold medal in Mexico City. Durr also competed in the National 3X3 Tournament at the end of last season.

**MY OLD KENTUCKY HOME**

UofL added three freshmen, all of which are Kentucky natives, in Seygan Robins (Mercer County, Miss Kentucky Basketball and back-to-back state champion), Mykasa Robinson (Ashland), Molly Lockhart (Louisville Butler). The Cards now have five Kentucky natives on the roster with Lindsey Duvall (Bullitt East) and Jessica Laemmle (Mercy).

**CARDINALS WELCOME IN GREEN, KONNO AND PARKER**

UofL welcomes in the No. 14 recruiting class in the nation per ESPN HoopGurlz with Nyah Green, a 6-foot-1 guard from Allen, Texas, Ramani Parker, a 6-4 forward from Fresno, Calif., and Norika Konno, a 5-foot-10 guard from Sendai, Japan. It marks the eighth time in the last 10 years that UofL has compiled a top 15 class.

■ **Green** comes to Louisville as the No. 12-ranked player in the class of 2019, according to espnW HoopGurlz. The five-star prospect is tabbed as the seventh-best player at the guard position. She is ranked seventh overall and as the third-best guard by Prospects Nation. She led Bishop Lynch to a TAPPS 6A state runner-up last season, averaging 18.7 points, 8.0 rebounds and 2.1 assists in 37 games. At the conclusion of the season, she was named TAPPS 1-6A MVP.

■ **Konno** is a 5-foot-10 shooting guard from Seiwa High School in Sendai, Japan, and has an impressive resume of international experience. In early November, she was a member of the Japanese National Team and helped the team win a silver medal at the U18 Women's Asian Championships. She recorded 10-plus points in four of five games, including 19 points on 8-of-12 shooting, vs. China. She finished the tournament averaging 13.0 points, 4.0 rebounds and 2.5 assists per game.

■ **Parker** is a four-star prospect and is ranked 99th overall in the class of 2019, according to espnW HoopGurlz. She is rated No. 13 at the forward position by espnW. She is rated 29th overall and as the seventh-best forward by Prospects Nation.
