THE OPENING TIP

LOUISVILLE STEALERS

Louisville recorded a season-high 16 steals in the 95-73 win over Miami (Ohio). It marked the most steals in a game since they had 16 vs. Bowling Green (W, 83-58) and Lafayette (W, 92-48) in back-to-back games on Nov. 19 and Nov. 20, 2016. Last year, they had a season-high 15 steals vs. Murray State (W, 115-51) on Nov. 24, 2017. The Cards are averaging 10 steals per game and have had at least seven in every game.

GOING NITE NITE 300 TIMES

Asia Durr had two 3-pointers (2-6) in the win over Miami, giving her an even 300 3-pointers for her career. She is only the second player in program history with 300 3-pointers. She ranks second behind Shoni Schimmel, who has 387 career 3-pointers. As a sophomore, she connected on 119 3-pointers, which ranked second nationally and set school record. She had 115 3-pointers last season. With 33 points at Western Kentucky, 24 at Chattanooga, 20 at Boise State and 20 vs. Hartford, Durr has nine career 30-point games and 41 career 20-point games.

BIG QUARTERS

Louisville opened the Miami (Ohio) game with a 27-12 first quarter and outscored the Redhawks by seven the rest of the way. They used a 37-18 second quarter to pull away from Hartford on Saturday. Hartford outscored Louisville the other three quarters, 51-49 (1st: 16-18; 3rd: 15-15; 4th: 18-18). They used a 21-15 fourth quarter, which included an 8-0 run to squeak out a 58-56 win over Arizona State. At Boise State, they used a 19-3 run to win the third 22-13 to open up the game.

WALZ FACES FORMER TEAM

Head coach Jeff Walz served as an assistant coach at Nebraska from 1997 to 2001. It marks the second time that he has faced his former team - W, 65-51 (Dec. 20, 2010 in Las Vegas).

ABOUT THE CORNHUSKERS

Last season, Nebraska finished the season with a 22-11 overall record, 11-5 in the Big Ten, and advanced to the NCAA Tournament, falling to No. 7 seed Arizona State, 73-62 in the first round. They return four starters from that team and have opened the season with a 2-3 record. Their three losses are to Drake, 83-77, at Washington State in double overtime, 87-84, and at No. 21 Miami, 82-68. Their wins have come against USC Upstate, 87-64, and Radford, 77-39. They have eight players averaging more than 7.2 points per game. Freshman guard Sam Haiby leads them in scoring with 11.4 points per game, while sophomore guard Taylor Kissinger is second with 9.6 points per game and ranks second in the nation in 3-point shooting percentage at 66.7 (12-18).

■ **Series History** - UofL is 2-1 all-time against the Cornhuskers and 1-0 at home. This will mark the first matchup between the two teams since they played in Las Vegas on Dec. 20, 2010 (W, 65-51). They met twice in non-conference play in 1998-99 when head coach Jeff Walz was an assistant at Nebraska. The Huskers defeated Louisville 62-61 in their final game at the Rainbow Wahine Classic on Nov. 29, 1998. Louisville then knocked off the Huskers 77-66 at the Seelbach Holiday Classic at Freedom Hall on Dec. 29, 1998.

EVANS ADDS SPARK OFF THE BENCH

Dana Evans is tied for third on the team with 8.5 points and is averaging a team-high 5.5 assists. After starting the first two games, she has come off the bench the last four. In the last three games, she is averaging 12.0 points and has 18 assists to just four turnovers. She has led the team in assists in four of six games. She had a season-high 14 points and a team-high six assists vs. Miami. She had 11 points and six assists, including the game-winning dish to Fuehring with 2.5 seconds to go vs. ASU. She scored eight of her 11 points in the fourth quarter. She then had 11 points and a team-high six assists and three steals vs. Hartford. She recorded nine assists at UTC, which was one shy of her career-high of 10 at Kentucky (12/17/17).

ACC/BIG TEN CHALLENGE

Last season, the ACC went 10-4 in the ACC/Big Ten Challenge. The ACC is 8-0-3 in the challenge. UofL is 3-1 in the ACC/B1G Challenge. 2017 – Louisville 72, Indiana 59 (at IU); 2016 - Maryland 78, Louisville 72 (at UL); 2015 - Louisville 85, Michigan State 78 (at MSU); 2014 - Louisville 86, Iowa 52 (at UL)

BIG TEN SUPREMACY

Last season, UofL went 3-0 vs. B1G teams, beating No. 5 Ohio State, 95-90, No. 24 Michigan, 74-49 and Indiana, 72-59. Louisville is 31-32 all-time against the Big Ten.

EN-DURR-ANCE

Durr is averaging 21.2 points per game through six games. She ranks second in the ACC and 22nd in the country. She is connecting on 3.7 3-point field goals per game, which leads the ACC and ranks ninth in the country. She is 19-20 (.950) from the free throw line, which ranks 12th in the nation. In the season opener at WKU, she scored the Cards' first 11 points and finished with 33 to set UofL's all-time record for points in an opener. She scored her 33 points in just 21 minutes, shooting 12-21 from the floor and 7-15 from 3-point range. She followed that by scoring 24 points at Chattanooga, 14 of which came during a 30-10 third quarter. She finished 7-14 from the floor, 5-10 from deep, with three assists and four rebounds. At Boise State, she had a team-high 20 points and four assists, while also pulling down seven rebounds. She had 14 points vs. ASU, 20 points vs. Hartford and 16 points and a team-high seven rebounds vs. Miami.

B BRINGER HER "A" GAME

Bionca Dunham has started the last four games after getting her first career start vs. Boise State on 11/19. On the season, she is averaging 7.8 points, while shooting 19-29 (.655) from the floor, and pulling down 3.2 rebounds. Against Miami (Ohio), she finished with a season-high 15 points on 7-10 shooting, while adding a team-high and career-high four steals.

GOT SHOOK UP

Kylee Shook is tied for third on the team with 8.5 points per game, while shooting 6-12 (.500) from downtown and pulling down 4.0 rebounds. She also leads the team with six blocks. She scored a season-high and team-high 17 points, 6-9 from the floor and 1-3 from 3-pt range, while adding a season-high six rebounds, including five offensive boards, in the win over Miami (Ohio).

STARTING OFF 6-0

For the third straight season, Louisville has started off with at least a 6-0 record. They started off 6-0 in 2016-17 and a school-record 20-0 in 2017-18.

TURN UP THE AC

Carter ranks fifth on team with 8.5 points per game and is shooting 12-22 (.545) from distance, ranks 17th in the country. She ranked 4th in the country, shooting 11-18 (.611), prior to going 1-4 vs. Miami. After not starting the first three games, she has started the last three. She didn't start vs. WKU, which ended a stretch of 64 straight starts in games that she has played. Last season, she started all 38 games she played. The previous time that she played, but didn't start was 12/10/15 at UK. Despite not starting, she scored a career-high 19 points in 19 minutes, shooting 6-10 from the floor and 4-7 from 3-point range. She tied a career-high with four threes, a feat she has accomplished four times. She had 16 points and tied her career high with four made 3-pointers (4-5) at Boise State. She missed the 2016-17 season with a groin injury. She shot 38.6 percent from 3-point range and connected on 49 3-pointers after entering last season with a career 16 made threes.

JONESIN' FOR MORE JAZZ

Jones fouled out in just 13 minutes vs. Miami, finishing with 10 points (5-6) and six rebounds. She led the team with seven assists in 26 minutes at WKU. She was named to the ACC All-Tournament team a year ago. She started all 39 games last year, joining Myisha Hines-Allen as the only players to do so. She ranked fourth on team with 8.9 points and 4.6 rebounds.

FUEHRING NAMED SOUTH POINT SHOOTOUT ALL-TOURNEY TEAM

Fuehring was named to the South Point Shootout All-Tournament team after averaging 18.5 points and seven rebounds. She had a team-high 18 points and nine rebounds, including the game-winning layup with three seconds to go vs. Arizona State, then had 19 points, which tied a career-high, and five rebounds vs. Hartford. She was also 8-8 from the line. She is averaging 11.3 points, while shooting 23-41 (.561) from the floor, and a team-high 5.3 rebounds. She had a team-high eight rebounds at Boise State, adding nine points. She had 10 points and 0 rebounds vs. Miami, it marked first time since March 20, 2017 vs. Tennessee in NCAA Tournament that she didn't pull down a rebound.

HOME COURT ADVANTAGE

UofL boasts a 124-15 record (.892) at the KFC Yum! Center. All-time in the venue, UofL holds a plus-22.3 scoring margin. Louisville hit a milestone during the 2016-17 campaign when attendance surpassed the one-million mark for women's basketball games. Through 139 games, Louisville averages 9,315 per contest and has welcomed more than one million fans through the doors of the KFC Yum! Center.

BEST FANS IN THE COUNTRY

Louisville welcomed in 7,544 for their home opener on Monday. They averaged 7,836 fans last season, which ranked fifth in the country, and their 148,887 total fans ranked third. 78,126 fans attended the final eight games at the KFC Yum! Center last year, an average of 9,766 per game. They had 3 straight 10,000-plus attendance games vs. ND, FSU, WF, which marked the largest 3-game attendance since they had 37,259 total vs. Pitt, UNC and BC in 2014-15. The 14,248 fans for the Top-15 match-up between Louisville and Florida State marked 3rd highest attendance last year in women's basketball, (1st - 15,564 - Notre Dame at UConn; 2nd - 14,763 - Tennessee at South Carolina). It also marked highest attendance for a women's game at the KFC Yum! Center since they had 16,524 for their opener vs. California on 11/15/15.

THIRD QUARTER BURSTS IN FIRST THREE GAMES

In the first three games, UofL outscored opponents 83-31 in the third quarter. They led WKU 54-43 at halftime and then took control of the game by outscoring the Hilltoppers 31-8 in the third. At Chattanooga, they led 28-21 at half and won the third quarter 30-10 to open up the game. At Boise State, the Cardinals led 31-28 and used a 19-3 run to win the third 22-13 and open up the game.

TURNOVERS A PROBLEM

UofL is averaging 16.8 turnovers per game. They turned it over just 13 times vs. Miami after having a season-high 21 turnovers in the win over Hartford. The Hawks scored 27 points off turnovers, which marked the most points off turnovers by an opponent since Western Kentucky had 29 in a 68-61 Louisville victory on Dec. 11, 2016. They are giving up 14.0 points off turnovers per game. Last season, the Cards averaged 13.6 turnovers per game. In the win over Oregon State in the NCAA Regional Final, they turned the ball over just three times to set a school record and tie an NCAA Tournament record (Louisiana Tech had just three turnovers vs. UC Santa Barbara on March 15, 2002). They allowed 19 points off turnovers vs. Toledo and Mississippi State a year ago, which marked the season high.

WINNING AT THE BUZZER

Evans found Fuehring underneath the basket for a layup with :02.5 seconds remaining to give the Cards a 58-56 win over Arizona State on Friday. It marked the first time that Louisville has won on a last second shot since Myisha Hines-Allen scored with :02 seconds left to secure a 74-71 win at Georgia Tech on 12/28/17.

BALANCED ATTACK

Eight players are averaging more than 6.0 points per game for the Cards. UofL played all 11 active players, 10 of which played double digit minutes, six scored in double figures and nine scored overall, in the win over Miami (Ohio). All 12 active players played in the 102-80 win over WKU in the opener. Ten players scored for the Cardinals and 10 played double-digit minutes. In the win over UTC, 11 players played with nine players getting in the scoring column. In the win over BSU, 11 played with 8 scoring. In the win over Hartford, 11 played and nine scored. Only nine played and seven scored vs. Arizona State.

DURR NAMED ACC PLAYER OF THE WEEK FOR SEVENTH TIME

Durr was named ACC Player of the Week on Nov. 12 after averaging 28.5 points per game in wins at Western Kentucky and Chattanooga. This marked the seventh time she has been named ACC POW and she earned the honor four times last season.

HEAD COACH JEFF WALZ

Head coach **Jeff Walz**, in his 12th season as a head coach, has compiled a 305-96 (.761) record as the Cardinals' leader. He has led Louisville to eight NCAA Sweet 16 appearances, three trips to Final 4 (2009, 2013, 2018), two of which culminated with NCAA runner-up finishes (2009, 2013). Walz, who is averaging 27.2 wins per season, became the winningest coach in program history in 2013-14. He also has the most 20-win seasons in school history (10) and the top-seven entries for most victories in a season (36 in 2017-18, 34 in 2008-09; 33 in 2013-14; and 29 in 2012-13 and 2016-17).



Hired on March 27, 2007, the Bluegrass State native took the program to its first NCAA Sweet 16 and it culminated with Louisville earning the No. 12 ranking in the final ESPN/USA Today Coaches Poll. For his efforts, Walz was named the WBCA Maggie Dixon Rookie Coach of the Year.

Prior to taking the reins at Louisville, Walz spent time on four other coaching staffs: Western Kentucky (1996-97), Nebraska (1997-01), Minnesota (2001-02), and Maryland (2002-07). He helped Maryland win the program's first national title in 2006.

WALZ IN THE BIG DANCE

Walz boasts a 27-10 record in NCAA Tournament games, which is 7th all-time in winning percentage and 4th among active coaches. He has directed UofL to a pair of national runner-up finishes (2009, 2013), three Final Fours (2009, 2013, 2018), four Elite Eights (2009, 2013, 2014, 2018), eight trips to the Sweet 16 and 10 NCAA Tournaments.

DURR NEARING 2,000 POINTS

Asia Durr passed Jazz Covington for 5th all-time with 20 points at Boise State. She now has 1,870 points and is 29 points away from tying Nell Knox for 4th place. Durr was the fifth player in program history to score 1,000 points within their first two years at Louisville.

WALZ GETS WIN NO. 300

Already the winningest coach in Louisville history, Coach Walz recorded his 300th career win (305-96) with a 102-80 victory at WKU. Walz led the Cards to a program-best 36-3 in 2017-18 record despite returning only two starters from a team that went 29-8 and reached the Sweet 16. UofL won its first 20 games last year, which set a program record for consecutive wins to start the year, and following its 100-67 win over then-No. 2 Notre Dame, moved up to No. 2 in the AP poll, its highest ranking ever.

WALZ VS. AP TOP 25

The 58-56 win over No. 19 Arizona State gave Walz his 54th win over an AP Top 25 team and his 42nd in the last nine years.

70-PLUS

UofL is 208-20 when surpassing the 70-point plateau under Walz. They have scored 70-plus in five of six games and are 5-0. UofL scored 70-plus in 27 of 39 games a year ago. The Cardinals were 27-0 when scoring 70-plus last year. They have won 34 straight games when scoring 70-plus points.

50/50

UofL has shot over 50 percent in 4 of 65 games, shooting .559 vs. WKU, .549 vs. UTC, .540 vs. Hartford and .515 vs. Miami. They are 4-0 in those games. They were 13-0 when shooting 50 percent or better last year. They boast a 102-1 record when shooting 50 percent or better from the field under Walz.

FINALLY COMING HOME

The Cardinals opened their home schedule on Monday with a 95-73 win over Miami (Ohio). They started the season with their first five games away from home, which marked the most away games to start the season since 2007-08 when they also opened with five away from Derby City.

WALZ AND HOME OPENERS

With the 95-73 win over Miami (Ohio), head coach Jeff Walz is now 10-2 in home openers at Louisville. The only losses a 75-71 defeat to California on Nov. 15, 2015 and a 63-50 loss to No. 4 Tennessee on Nov. 12, 2010 to open the KFC Yum! Center. Last season, they opened at home with an 80-40 win over Southeast Missouri.

PRESEASON AP AND USA TODAY RANKINGS

UofL was ranked fifth in the Associated Press 2018-19 preseason poll. The Cardinals were listed on all 31 ballots, receiving 664 points, including one third-place vote. The ranking is tied for the highest preseason position in program history. The Cards were previously slotted fifth before both the 2013-14 and 2016-17 seasons. They remained fifth in the AP poll this week. They were rated No. 4 in the USA Today Coaches Poll, which marks the highest preseason ranking in program history. The Cardinals received 687 points, just three points fewer than Oregon, who is rated No. 3. Prior to being ranked No. 4 this season, their highest ranking was No. 5 in 2013-14.

EARLIEST START TO THE SEASON

Louisville opened the season on Nov. 6, which marked the earliest start to the season in program history. The previous earliest start was Nov. 9 in 2012-13 and 2013-14.

IN NOVEMBER

Louisville is 65-13 in the month of November under head coach Jeff Walz.

HITTING THE CENTURY MARK

UofL opened the season with 102 points, which marked most points in opener. The previous high was 101 vs. Loyola Chicago in 2013. Last year, they scored 100-plus points twice, a school-record 115 vs. Murray State on 11/24/17 (W, 115-51) and vs. Notre Dame on 1/11/18 (W, 100-67). UofL is 22-0 all-time when scoring 100-plus.

SUCCESS AGAINST AP TOP 25 IN 2017-18

Louisville got its first win over an AP Top 25 opponent this season with a 58-56 win over No. 19 Arizona State in the South Point Shootout on Friday. They are 1-0 against AP Top 25 teams. Their previous Top 25 win was against No. 13 Oregon State in the NCAA Regional Final a year ago. They went 9-3 against Top 25 teams a season ago. In 2016-17, they had five wins over Top 25 teams. In 2017-18, the Cards had four wins over Top 10 teams, the most in program history. With the 100-67 win over No. 2 Notre Dame, the Cards recorded their first win at home against an AP Top 5 team in the Walz era. The Cards are now 1-8 at home against AP Top 5 teams under Walz. They are now 1-5 against AP Top 5 teams at the KFC Yum! Center (1/11/18 - W vs. No. 2 ND, 100-67; 12/1/16 - L vs. No. 5 Maryland, 78-72; 2/7/16 - L vs. No. 3 ND, 66-61, 3/3/14 - L vs. No. 1 UConn, 68-48; 2/7/12 - L vs. No. 3 UConn, 56-46; 11/12/10 - L vs. No. 4 Tennessee, 63-50). UofL moved up to No. 2 following their win over then-No. 2 Notre Dame, marking their highest ranking ever.

NONCONFERENCE SUCCESS

Head coach Jeff Walz has compiled an impressive 140-33 record (.809) against nonconference foes in his 12 years at the helm. Last year, UofL went 14-1 in non-conference play, which marked the third time they have recorded just one non-conference loss under Walz. Two times previously - in 2008-09 and 2013-14 - he rolled through nonconference play with just one loss, sporting 13-1 and 12-1 records.

COACHING STAFF CONSISTENCY

For the sixth straight season, Walz has the same assistants with Stephanie Norman (12th year), Sam Williams (8th) and Sam Purcell (6th year). Walz and Norman have been together all 12 seasons.

ON THE ROAD AGAIN

The Cards have won 150 games away from home since head coach Jeff Walz's arrival in 2007-08. The Cardinals boast a 150-71 (.679) record in those contests (includes 45-23 record for neutral site games).

■ **Last Year:** In 2017-18, the Cardinals owned an 18-2 record away from the KFC Yum! Center (includes 5-1 neutral record).

MELTING POT

Louisville's 2018-19 roster continues last year's pattern of being diverse. Of the 13 student-athletes on its roster, eight are from different states (California, Colorado, Florida, Georgia, Indiana, Kentucky, New Jersey, Pennsylvania). Yacine Diop is the only international player and she is from Dakar, Senegal.

DIOP OUT FOR SEASON WITH ACL INJURY

Redshirt senior Yacine Diop suffered a season-ending ACL injury (left) vs. Arizona State. She recorded a double-double with 11 points and 10 rebounds in just 18 minutes in her debut as a Cardinal. It marked the 15th double-double of her career. A graduate transfer from Pitt and member of Senegal's national team, Diop led the Panthers with 15.7 points and 6.4 rebounds a year ago. She tied a career high with 26 points against Louisville on Jan. 18. She departed Pitt as the 18th leading scorer of all-time with 1,093 points.

UOFL'S SUCCESS BY DECADES

With Walz at the helm of the program, the Cardinals are averaging 26 victories per season and attained their 800th win (852-487) in program history with the victory over Clemson on Jan. 26, 2017. Louisville has been most successful under Walz's watch and since the 2000s. During the current decade, though not finished, the Cardinals boast a 78.6 winning percentage.

WALZ GETS WIN #300 WHERE IT ALL STARTED

Walz recorded his 300th win at WKU where he began his collegiate coaching career. He served as an assistant coach under Paul Sanderford during the 1996-97 season. He helped the team earn an at-large bid to the 1997 NCAA Tournament after going 22-9 to earn a share of the Sun Belt regular-season title. The next season, he moved on to Nebraska after Sanderford was offered the head coaching position.

LOUISVILLE CHOSEN SECOND IN ACC PRESEASON POLLS

The Cardinals were picked to finish second in both the Atlantic Coast Conference's Blue Ribbon Panel and coaches' polls. Louisville received 870 points from the Blue Ribbon Panel, including three first place votes. Notre Dame was picked to win the title in both polls.

DURR NAMED PRESEASON ALL-ACC

Senior guard Asia Durr was selected to the 2018-19 Preseason All-ACC Team, as voted on by the league's coaches and the Blue Ribbon panel. Durr was named ACC Player of the Year last season after leading Louisville to a sweep of ACC regular season and tournament titles. She finished the year averaging 18.7 points, while knocking down 115 3-pointers, which ranked 13th in the country, and shooting 41.5 percent from beyond the arc.

DURR NAMED AP PRESEASON ALL-AMERICAN, WOODEN WATCH LIST

Durr has been selected to the 2018-19 Associated Press Preseason All-America team. Durr was named on 29 of 31 ballots, tying her with Oregon junior Sabrina Ionescu for the highest vote total on the team. She was named one of 30 players on Wooden Award Watch List.

DURR RATED NO. 2 ON ESPNW TOP 25 PLAYERS LIST

Asia Durr was listed No. 2 on ESPNW's Top 25 player list behind only Oregon's Sabrina Ionescu. Last season, she was rated No. 7 in the country.

DURR NAMED TO MEYERS DRYSDALE AWARD WATCH LIST; FUEHRING NAMED TO LESLIE AWARD WATCH LIST; BOTH NAMED TO NAISMITH TROPHY AWARD WATCH LIST

The Naismith Memorial Basketball Hall of Fame announced that Durr is one of 20 watch list candidates for the 2019 Ann Meyers Drysdale Award, while Fuehring is one of 20 watch list candidates for the 2019 Lisa Leslie Award. The Drysdale award recognizes the top shooting guard, while the Leslie award recognizes top center. They were both also recognized on the Citizen Naismith Trophy Award Watch List. As a junior, Fuehring ranked third on the team with 9.9 points and second with 5.4 rebounds. She took a team-high 40 charges and 10 times recorded multiple charges in a game, including six in the win at Ohio State. She was named to the ACC All-Tournament Team, Lexington Regional All-Tournament Team and ACC All-Academic Team.

CHALLENGING SCHEDULE

Seven of the Cardinals' opponents this season were ranked in the Associated Press' preseason top 25 (No. 1 Notre Dame, No. 2 Connecticut, No. 17 NC State, No. 18 Syracuse, No. 21 Duke, No. 23 Arizona State and No. 25 Miami (Fla.)). An additional six opponents received votes in the poll, Central Michigan, Nebraska, Boise State, Florida State, Virginia, Virginia Tech).

■ **Postseason Play** - The Cardinals face nine non-conference opponents that reached postseason play a season ago, seven that won 20-plus games and six that played in the NCAA Tournament. The ACC saw eight teams win 20-plus games in 2017-18. In addition, eight ACC squads earned berths in the NCAA Women's Basketball Championship, including Louisville and Notre Dame, who advanced to the Final Four.

LOUISVILLE UNVEILS ASIA25.COM

The University of Louisville announced the unveiling of Asia25.com, a new website to promote senior guard Asia Durr for National Player of the Year. U of L launched the website by telling the story of Durr – her journey to Louisville and the accomplishments she has already achieved. A series of short 15-second videos were released throughout the day on social media to raise awareness for Asia25.com, where the University of Louisville will continue to house her National Player of the Year campaign.

LOFTY EXPECTATIONS

Returning all-american Asia Durr, along with returning starters Arica Carter, Sam Fuehring and Jazmine Jones, the Cardinals were picked fourth in the USA Today/Coaches' rankings, which set a school record, and were selected fifth in the Associated Press preseason poll to tie a school record. They were also selected in the top six by Lindy's (4th), ESPNW (4th), Street & Smith (5th), Athlon (6th).

RETURNING POINT PRODUCTION

Louisville returns 60.6 points per game, 79.0 percent of their production from a year ago.

RETURNING STARTERS

The Cardinals return four from a year ago (Carter, Durr, Fuehring, Jones). The quartet combined for 45.1 points.

The rest of the returning roster combined for 15.5 points in 2017-18, led by Dana Evans' 5.1 points per game. Overall, the Cardinals return players with 240 career starts prior to this season, led by Durr's 76 career starts, while Carter ranks second with 68.

ANOTHER 20-WIN SEASON

After going 36-3 in 2017-18, head coach Jeff Walz now has 10 20-win seasons in 11 years, adding to what was already the most in school history. In the eight-year stretch that begins with the 2010-11 season, Louisville has compiled a 225-63 mark (.781).

■ **Longest stretch in school history** - UofL has won at least 20 games for eight consecutive seasons, the longest stretch in program history. The longest run previously was three, achieved just twice in school history.

MOST WINS IN SCHOOL HISTORY

UofL recorded its 36th win last year vs. Oregon State, which marks the most in a single season. Louisville went 34-5 and advanced to NCAA title game in 2008-09. The 29 regular season wins also marked the most regular season wins in program history. The top seven win totals in school history have all come with Walz as head coach.

DURR NAMED ACC PLAYER OF YEAR, WALZ NAMED COACH OF YEAR

Last season, Durr was named ACC Player of the Year by the Blue Ribbon Panel and the Coaches, while Coach Walz was named ACC Coach of the Year by both, as well. Durr was also named ACC Preseason Player of the Year. It marked the second time in three years that a UofL player has won the honor as Myisha Hines-Allen won it as a sophomore in 2015-16. It marks Walz's first Coach of the Year honor.

THIS ONE IS FOUR THE CARDS

Last year, UofL advanced to its third NCAA Final 4 in school history (2009, 2013, 2018) with a 76-43 win over Oregon State. All three Final 4 appearances have occurred in the last 10 years under the guidance of head coach Jeff Walz. They are 2-1 in Final 4 games.

SWEEPING CONFERENCE REGULAR SEASON/TOURNAMENT TITLES

In 2017-18, UofL swept conference regular season and tournament titles for first time since they swept the Metro in 1984. It marked the second time in history that they have won both. It marked their first ACC regular season title and their first regular season conference title since they won C-USA in 2001. It marked their first ACC Tournament title and their first conference tournament title since they won the Metro Tournament in 1993. They have won six regular season titles (1984, 1992, 1997, 1999, 2001, 2018) and six conference tournament titles, the first five in the Metro (1980, 1981, 1983, 1984, 1993, 2018).

EQUALING BEST ACC REGULAR SEASON RECORD

At 15-1 in league play last year, UofL won its first ACC regular season title. The 15-1 record matched best record in ACC as they had same record in 15-16, finished second to Notre Dame.

BEST ROAD RECORD IN SCHOOL HISTORY, 8-0 IN ACC ROAD GAMES

The Cards wrapped up road play with a 13-1 record in 2017-18, their best road mark in program history. They finished 12-2 in 2013-14 and 2008-09. At 8-0 on the road in league play, the Cards wrapped ACC play with a perfect 8-0 road record for the 2nd time in three years. They also went 8-0 on the road in ACC in 2015-16, when they finished 15-1. Overall, they have won 10 straight ACC road games. UofL's 13-game road winning streak dating back to 2016-17, which tied the longest road winning streak in program history, came to a close with the 69-58 loss at UConn last season. They also won 13 straight road games from 12/18/15 to 12/21/16. Prior to the defeat to the Huskies, their last road loss was an 85-66 setback at Notre Dame on Feb. 6, 2017. They won their first 11 road games last season, which marked the longest road winning streak in a single season, surpassing the 10-game road winning streak in 2015-16.

WELCOME TO SPORTSCENTER

Senior guard Asia Durr was one of seven Division I women's basketball players and 10 participants invited to Women's Basketball National Media Day, hosted by the NCAA and ESPN, on ESPN's campus in Bristol, Conn. It marked the second straight season that she was invited. Her schedule included a one-on-one sit-down with ESPN sideline reporter Holly Rowe, a fast-paced interview with ESPN analyst Rebecca Lobo, a one-hour press conference with national media, an appearance on the Around the Rim podcast, hosted by LaChina Robinson, and more.

USA USA USA!

Asia Durr, along with former card Angel McCoughtry, has been selected to the 2017-20 USA Basketball Women's National Team Pool, from which the 2018 USA World Cup Team is expected to be selected. This past summer, Jeff Walz served as head coach of the U19 National Team and led Team USA to a gold medal in Mexico City. Durr also competed in the National 3X3 Tournament at the end of last season.

MY OLD KENTUCKY HOME

Louisville added three freshmen, all of which are Kentucky natives, in Seygan Robins (Mercer County, Miss Kentucky Basketball and back-to-back state champion), Mykasa Robinson (Ashland), Molly Lockhart (Louisville Butler). The Cards now have five Kentucky natives on the roster with Lindsey Duvall (Bullitt East) and Jessica Laemmle (Mercy Academy Louisville).

CARDINALS WELCOME IN GREEN, KONNO AND PARKER

Louisville welcomes in the No. 14 recruiting class in the nation per ESPN HoopGurlz with Nyah Green, a 6-foot-1 guard from Allen, Texas, Ramani Parker, a 6-4 forward from Fresno, Calif., and Norika Konno, a 5-foot-10 guard from Sendai, Japan. It marks the eighth time in the last 10 years that the Cardinals' coaching staff has compiled a top 15 class.

■ **Green** comes to Louisville as the No. 12-ranked player in the class of 2019, according to ESPN HoopGurlz. The five-star prospect is tabbed as the seventh-best player at the guard position. She is ranked seventh overall and as the third-best guard by Prospects Nation. She led Bishop Lynch to a TAPPS 6A state runner-up last season, averaging 18.7 points, 8.0 rebounds and 2.1 assists in 37 games. At the conclusion of the season, she was named TAPPS 1-6A MVP.

■ **Konno** is a 5-foot-10 shooting guard from Seiwa High School in Sendai, Japan, and has an impressive resume of international experience. In early November, she was a member of the Japanese National Team and helped the team win a silver medal at the U18 Women's Asian Championships. She recorded 10-plus points in four of five games, including 19 points on 8-of-12 shooting, vs. China. She finished the tournament averaging 13.0 points, 4.0 rebounds and 2.5 assists per game.

■ **Parker** is a four-star prospect and is ranked 99th overall in the class of 2019, according to ESPN HoopGurlz. She is rated No. 13 at the forward position by ESPNW. She is rated 29th overall and as the seventh-best forward by Prospects Nation. Parker played for Central High School in Fresno, Calif., before transferring to Montverde Academy in Montverde, Fla., for her senior season.
